ABOUT THE COMMUNITY

For 102 residents living in El Rosario, water access was difficult and dangerous. The community relied on a piped water system that was falling apart. Often the residents only received water from the pipes every few days or twice a week. The water from the pipes filled outdoor basins outside many of the homes where women washed dishes and drew water for other household uses. The scarcity of water hindered them from caring for their families, but there were other problems as well.

The water in the pipes was of poor quality, and even more contagions were introduced because the water was exposed to the open air. The community members often suffered from water-related illnesses as a result. The only way to avoid this risk was to abstain from using water, and this left them thirsty and compromised their cleanliness. No one should be faced with this kind of a dilemma. Community leaders knew that something had to be done.

CONSTRUCTION

The community president, Francisca Cruz Gonzales, decided to advocate for her family and neighbors. When she heard about Living Water International's work in the region, she had faith that they could benefit her community. She made contact with the Living Water El Salvador staff and requested their help. The staff was glad to respond to her appeal by scheduling a visit to the community. When they arrived, the staff could see immediately that the water access situation was a crisis. They decided to drill a well for the community, and you made this plan a reality, Plummer Associates!

The Living Water staff soon returned to begin work along with your team. They drilled until they reached a safe water aquifer 70 meter deep. They flushed the borehole to remove rock debris. Next, the team cased the borehole with PVC piping and a stabilizing gravel pack. Once they installed the well base and platform, the project was complete!

SUSTAINABILITY

The Living Water El Salvador staff helped the community members to establish patterns to manage their safe water system in order keep the water reliable and safe long-term. With the staff's guidance, the community members formed a water committee that will oversee the use and upkeep of the system. The committee will collect a small fee per household for use of the water in order to save a fund to cover the cost of future repairs to the well. They will also remain in contact with Living Water about the functionality of the well, communicating any need for assistance with repairs. In this way, the community members will forge their own path into sustainable water access through community-driven solutions.

"We have been using water from an old system that was collapsing. We had faucet connections in our homes, but they only gave us water every now and then, sometimes once a week. Also, we knew that water was contaminated. It gave us many stomach problems. We often walked three kilometers to the river to wash our clothes when the faucets were dry. We are expecting that things will be better for everyone now that there is plenty of safe water. It will help our community develop and help us all stay healthier."

SANITATION & HYGIENE

The Living Water Trips team and staff also led a sanitation and hygiene promotional activity for 62 community members. The staff used visual aids and interactive elements to make the concepts relevant and memorable for all ages. One of the lessons explained how germs are spread and how diseases are transmitted. The team taught the participants proper handwashing technique as a preventative measure against germ spread. They also led a fun, interactive lesson on brushing teeth. Another more prescriptive lesson focused on mixing an oral rehydration solution out of safe water, salt, and sugar to treat the vicious cycle of dehydration and diarrhea. The participants learned that their need for this remedy should subside as they can now drink plenty of safe water.
