Beginning Korean 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Understand crucial grammar and natural communication- Learn various expressions to use public facilities and public institution facilities in Korea- Learn appropriate expressions for various situations	200hr
Intermediate Korean	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Read and understand different types of text- Express your opinions and communicate with others in daily lives.- Clear pronunciation and writing of Korean language- Understanding Korean formal language, as well as lifestyle, culture and traditions (proverbs, idioms, fairy tales, etc)- Read and summarize articles on social issues in Korea.	200hr

Traditional Culture Experience	<p>▶ Korean traditional · cultural experience</p> <p>Activities to understand Korean history and culture in a deeper depth by experiencing various Korean traditional cultures</p> <p>- Visits to Korean historical palaces and museums: National Museum of Korea, Seoul Museum of History, Changgyeonggung Palace (World Heritage), Gyeongbokgung Palace, Insadong, Folk village, DMZ, etc.</p> <p>- Korean traditional culture and art experience: Hanji craft, Palace experience, Hanbok Experience, Taekwondo try-out, Traditional musical instrument experience, etc</p> <p>- Korean traditional food experience: Making Kimchee and other cuisine, traditional tea, rice cake, Korean confectionery, jang, etc</p> <p>- Cultural performance experience: Visiting popular artist's concert (SM, K-POP, etc), visiting amusement parks (Everland and Lotte World), participating in local festivals</p>
Company Visits	<p>▶ Visits to major companies in Korea and hands-on experience</p> <p>Activities to understand the characteristics of Korean economy and high technologies by experiencing on-site work through visiting Korean companies</p> <p>- Institutes to visit Korean Parliament building, Korean Ministry of Foreign Affairs, popular cosmetics manufacturing company (Amorepacific), CJ E&M headquarters, Samsung Electronics D'light Experience Center, Liquor (beer) manufacturing company (Hite Jinro), Korean traditional liquor manufacturing company (Kuksundang), proceed food manufacturing company (Maeil Dairy)</p>
