RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR FIFTH FORM TRIAL EXAMINATIONS

As with any other examination conducted in the school, pupils must ensure they follow the rules and regulations regarding them (see Rule 3b – Academic Integrity). Any deviation from these rules and regulations will be regarded as a serious breach of school discipline and the matter will be referred to a senior member of staff.

STUDY LEAVE

From Monday 4th to Friday, 15th January 2021, the school timetable for Fifth-Form will be suspended. You will only be expected to attend school on days that you have examinations. When you have completed all your examinations for the day, you should go home.

If you have a morning exam, you must arrive at school in time for morning registration (by 8:40am). If you have an afternoon exam only, you must arrive in school between 12:10pm and 12:30pm, for registration. If you arrive after 12:30pm, you will be deemed late.

Punctuality is of the utmost importance. Exams will start promptly, and it may not be possible to give latecomers the full examination time.

Private Study is shown on the timetable. If you fail to use this time properly, to revise for subsequent exams, your study leave will be cancelled.

BEFORE THE EXAMINATION

- You should line up outside the Reception area at 8:55am, for exams commencing period 1; at 10:40am for exams commencing period 3, and at 1:45pm for exams commencing period 7.
- Listen carefully to the instructions that you are given before you enter the exam room. Leave your schoolbag where directed.
- Pencil cases and water bottles must be fully transparent, with no patterns or labels.
- All digital communication devices, **including smart watches**, are strictly forbidden in the exam room.
- Correcting fluid and calculator cases are also not allowed in the exam room.
- When you enter the exam room you must remain standing, **in silence**, until you are told to sit down by the invigilator. An examination is deemed to be in progress from the time you enter the room until the time that you are dismissed from the exam room.
- Wrist watches, which are permitted by the regulations, must be removed and placed on your desk.
- You **must** write your answers in **black ink**, unless an invigilator instructs you otherwise. Diagrams may be drawn in pencil or coloured ink, but coloured gel-pens should not be used.
- You must not talk to, try to disturb, or communicate with other pupils in any way, during the examination. Under no circumstances may you share equipment with, or borrow equipment from, another pupil. Raise your hand, and speak with an invigilator, if you have a problem.
- You must write your name, your form, your teacher's name and set on every sheet of paper that you use.

AT THE END OF THE EXAMINATION

- When you are told to stop writing, you **must** remain in silence until you are dismissed from the exam room.
- If you have no further examinations that day, and once you have been dismissed from the exam, you should collect your bag and leave school immediately (via Seagrave Road, if the examination ends before 3.30pm).

PUPILS WHO MISS EXAMINATIONS

If you miss an examination, owing to illness or self-isolation, you must sit the paper(s) you have missed at the **earliest opportunity**. This may require you to attend school to sit exams on days when you would otherwise have no timetabled exams. You must see Miss Coles-Lockwood by 8:10am (if returning during the exam fortnight), or your subject teacher (if returning after 15th January 2021), to confirm alternative examination times.
