A message from the Headmaster

Congratulations to all our upper sixth formers on completing their courses during a period of considerable disruption. We are delighted that they approached the challenges of studying in the face of a global pandemic with such resourcefulness and resilience and are confident that they are well-prepared for the future challenges ahead.

There are some remarkable individual achievements from our 177 leavers, including 7 pupils gaining 4A*s and a further 24 gaining 3A*s. As a whole cohort over 100 pupils gained 2 A grades or more with an average grade of A-.

These results are a tribute to the commitment of our pupils and of our teachers who showed remarkable dedication in ensuring that the educational experience of our pupils continued in difficult circumstances. In addition, teachers had a significant increase in their workload in generating Teacher Assessed Grades.

As ever, our pupils have successfully negotiated the university application process, securing places at leading UK institutions, with 18 preparing to take up places at Oxford and Cambridge, 12 heading to Bristol, 11 moving to Edinburgh and half a dozen or more heading for Durham, Exeter, Nottingham, Manchester and Leeds. Sixteen are staying closer to home by attending leading London institutions, including LSE, UCL, KCL, Queen Mary and Imperial. So far over one hundred pupils have been confirmed onto courses at Russell Group institutions.

We also have a number of pupils starting degree courses abroad, including North American universities such as Georgetown and McGill, and two embarking on sports scholarships in the United States for football and beach volleyball. We also have our first successful applicant for the ESCP (École Supérieure de Commerce de Paris) Business School. The vast majority of our pupils have secured places at their first choice institution. We are optimistic that pupils who narrowly missed out on their preferred choices will secure suitable places through clearing and we will be supporting pupils in navigating this process in the next week.

We are immensely proud of all our upper sixth-formers and will continue to support them as they start their next chapter of their lives.



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
