Most of us are acquainted with mouth-sizzling hot sauce, especially those of us who like Mexican food. It really brings out the flavor of the food, doesn't it?

Key Verse

Stick

The life application meaning of this verse is tied to the image of **hot sauce**.

Clicker: Hot Sauce

Whenever you see, taste, or think about *hot sauce*, let this HoneyWord heat up your heart as it clicks and sticks.



Read Revelation 3:15-16

Make-it-Stick

The next time you have some tortilla chips, try dipping one in some lukewarm water. It's pretty tasteless and soggy, isn't it? Now dip a chip in some hot sauce. All you need is a tiny drop. Brings out the salty flavor, doesn't it? When we're excited about following Jesus, it's as thrilling to God as if he were eating tortilla chips totally covered with hot sauce! Say this HoneyWord as you dip and eat another chip.

Everyone Take Turns Explaining the Meaning of this Lesson in Your Own Words

Ask, "What does this lesson mean?" If the answer is in the ballpark of the correct meaning, praise that person out loud. Then ask another child to explain it. Do this 2 or 3 times in a row.

Hold Up the Clicker

Hold up the Click-er (hot sauce) and say this HoneyWord Lesson out loud:

"I'm *hot sauce* for the One True Boss."

Then repeat it out loud together one more time.

Pair Up in Small Groups of Two

If you're with more than one child, have your children pair up and ask each other to say the lesson out loud to each other.

Re-Group and Recite Again

Ask one child to say the lesson one more time, and then explain what it means.
