Dr. Da'Marcus Baymon is from

In 2021, he completed his four-

MEDICAL DIRECTOR, BWH QUALITY, SAFETY AND EQUITY Nadia Huancahuari, MD



Nadia Huancahuari, MD, is a Brigham Health Medical Director of Quality, Safety, and Equity. In this role, she promotes a culturally competent health care system capable of delivering the highestquality and safest care available to every patient regardless of race, ethnicity, social class, culture,

ability to pay, or language proficiency. She leads equity-focused patient safety initiatives and delivers equity-based education for providers and staff.

Previously, she served as the Director of Quality and Safety in the Department of Emergency Medicine at Brigham Health. During her tenure, she led a comprehensive quality assurance and performance improvement team that continuously monitored, evaluated and improved the quality and safety of care provided to patients at three clinical sites—BWH ED, BWFH ED and Foxborough Urgent Care. She has designed, implemented and sustained numerous process improvement programs both within the Emergency Department and in collaboration with other departments at Brigham Health. Her work has always focused on improving healthcare disparities in emergency care and beyond.

Nadia is also the recipient of the 2021 Distinguished Clinician Award, being granted this prestigious award for her recognition as an outstanding clinician, established reputation as a physician's physician, and contributions in the areas of education, scholarship, administration, and service.

Dr. Marsh is an Assistant Professor of Emergency Medicine at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Marsh was recently appointed the Brigham and Women's Hospital Medical Director of Quality, Safety and Equity in the Department of Quality and Safety. Her work focuses on advancing health equity at the hospital level

and we congratulate her in this new role. Dr. Marsh co-founded and co-chairs the health equity committee for the Office of IDEaS. Dr. Marsh has had a long interest in global health. Since 2008, Dr. Marsh has worked with Partners In Health in Malawi, Haiti, Sierra Leone and Liberia to strengthen health systems after emergencies, ranging from the earthquake in Haiti to Ebola in West Africa. During the COVID-19 pandemic, she has served as the senior technical lead for PIH's domestic work, centering equity and justice as part of the community-based response.

Dr. Marsh received her undergraduate degree from Princeton University and her medical degree from the University of Pennsylvania's School of Medicine. She completed emergency medicine training at the Harvard-Affiliated Emergency Medicine Residency at Brigham and Women's and Massachusetts General hospitals and received a Master of Public Health from Harvard School of Public Health

Director, Global Ultrasound



Dr. Eke is an emergency medicine physician and Director of Global Ultrasound in the Department of Emergency Medicine at Massachusetts General Hospital. She received her undergraduate degree from the University of Maryland, College Park and medical degree from Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, Baltimore. Dr Eke completed emergency medicine residency training at Cook County Hospital, Chicago and fellowship in

emergency ultrasound at Massachusetts General Hospital. Dr Eke is a national and international point-of-care ultrasound educator. In 2020, she received the Academy of Emergency Ultrasound Fellow Education Award by the Society for Academic Emergency Medicine. Her research focus is the development of point-of-care ultrasound education and training in resource-limited settings, particularly in Sub-Saharan Africa, and the efficient utilization of point-of-care ultrasound to facilitate patient care in the emergency department.
