September Highlights

Facts about September



September 1st, 1939, In the early hours of the morning Hitler invades Poland, starting World War II.



September 2nd, 1666: Great Fire of London will burn the city from Sunday September 2nd through Thursday September 6th, the fire started in a bakery on Pudding Lane destroying all the medieval City of London. A total of 13,200 homes, 87 Parish Churches, St. Paul's Cathedral, and most of the public buildings were lost to the fire.



September 5th, 1774: The first Continental Congress meets at Carpenter's Hall in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, from September 5 to October 26, 1774. Delegates from twelve of the thirteen colonies that would ultimately join in the Revolutionary War participated.



September 9th, 1776: The Continental Congress changes the name from United Colonies to United States, a name that has remained to this day. The graph is a Benjamin Franklin Cartoon used to promote the union.



September 11th, 2001: The twin towers of the World Trade Center are attacked by al-Qaida using hijacked airliners which crashed into the structures. 2,996 people were killed. A total of four passenger airplanes were hijacked on that day, two against New York City, one against the Pentagon in Washington DC and another one that was overtaken by heroes and crashed outside populated areas.



September 17th: Constitution Day is an American federal observance that recognizes the adoption of the United States Constitution and those who have become U.S. citizens. It is normally observed on September 17, the day in 1787 that delegates to the Constitutional Convention signed the document in Philadelphia.



September 22nd, 1862: President Abraham Lincoln issues the Emancipation Proclamation.

First Monday in September: Labor Day. The first governmental recognition came through municipal ordinances passed in 1885 and 1886. From these, a movement developed to secure state legislation. The first state bill was introduced into the New York legislature, but the first to become law was passed by Oregon on February 21, 1887. During 1887, four more states – Colorado, Massachusetts, New Jersey, and New York – created the Labor Day holiday by legislative enactment. By the end of the decade Connecticut, Nebraska, and Pennsylvania had followed suit. By 1894, 23 more states had adopted the holiday, and on June 28, 1894, Congress passed an act making the first Monday in September of each year a legal holiday in the District of Columbia and the territories.
