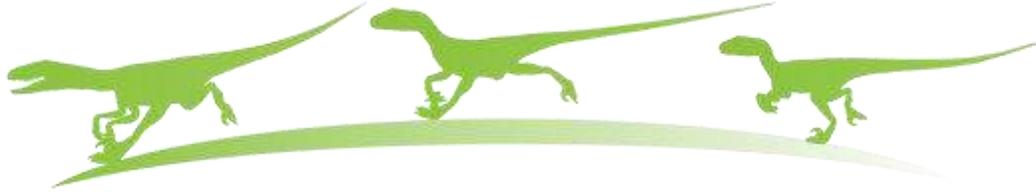

There is a \$10.00 per organization per meeting fee that will need to be covered before the meeting. Invoices will be sent.


The first meeting will cover:
