Native Counselling Services of Alberta (NCSA) is a diverse, dynamic non-government organization that is committed to the holistic wellness and equitable treatment of Alberta's Aboriginal individuals, families and communities since 1970. NCSA is currently looking for individual(s) to work within our team as Primary Care Workers (security) at our Healing Lodge. This position under the direction of the Operations Manager is responsible and essential to maintain the safety and security of the residents at the Healing Lodge, staff and public. The Primary Care worker will perform a variety of different functions including but not limited to overseeing resident's movement, conduct routine informal/formal rounds, counts and manage resident behavior.

The individual will work directly with residents, developing an in-depth knowledge of resident behaviors and personality traits. The Primary Care worker will also manage a caseload of residents with regular weekly contact to ensure the resident is actively incorporating NCSA Resiliency Model to develop appropriate goals that align with their correctional and healing plans to support their reintegration back into the community.

The positions are for full time and casual including nights.

Qualifications:

- Possess a minimum of Grade 12 with post-secondary education being an asset.
- Must provide recent Criminal Record/ Child Welfare Check and a valid First Aid and C.P.R. certificate.
- Possess knowledge and understanding of historic trauma and its impact on Indigenous people.
- Possess knowledge and understanding relating to Indigenous culture and ceremony and the approaches to healing.
- Learn NCSA Resiliency Model and incorporate it into daily practice with residents and staff.
- Must clear a Correctional Services Canada Enhanced Reliability security check to remain employed.
- Possess knowledge and understanding of the workings of the Parole Board of Canada, Correctional Services Canada, Corrections and Conditional Release Act and Corrections and Conditional Release regulations.
- Possess knowledge and understanding of legislation specific to Indigenous people within the criminal justice system such as the Canadian Criminal Code and the Corrections and Conditional Release Act as they pertain to Indigenous residents.
- Possess effective communication, decision making, and problem solving and time management skills.

- Must work effectively as part of a team with superior communication, interpersonal and documentation skills both oral and written.
- Possess knowledge and understanding of using computers and different software programs.
- Must have a reliable vehicle, valid Alberta class 5 driver's license with a clear driver's abstract, required liability insurance and confirmation of insurance coverage.
- Must act as a resource to management staff pertaining to questions and/or challenges of an operational nature.
- Must act as a resource to residents pertaining to questions and challenges.
