victory over the darkness in this world.












FORTY YEARS

FINANCIALS

God has blessed us with about 210,000 square feet of floor space at Main Campus alone, including over 145 classrooms and an extraordinary amount of equipment. We are blessed with over 110 acres of property and over 370,000 square feet of buildings among all campuses. Even with this much space, there continues to be great demand for our facilities by all the ministries of our church and school. Two new classroom buildings have been completed over the past year. Though these classrooms will primarily be used by our school, they will also benefit Life Groups on Sundays. These construction projects have also freed up 34 additional parking spaces adjacent to the Sossamon Chapel.

Our facility is utilized seven days per week with well over 10.000 people coming through on an average week. We strive for ways to efficiently maintain and upgrade our campus. We regularly review operating expenses to ensure we are good stewards of the resources that God provides.
