PROCEEDINGS OF THE MOTT CITY COUNCIL January 11, 2021

The Council met for their monthly scheduled meeting on Monday, January 11th, 2021. Present were Mayor Mosbrucker, Council members K. Messmer, Wangsvick Quamme, Steiner, Johnson, and J. Messmer. Kerry Mosbrucker, Lori Eggers, and Kyle Christiansen were also present. All motions are carried, unless otherwise stated.

K. Messmer moved and Wangsvick seconded the approval of the December 2020 minutes.

Deputy Christiansen presented the December police report. There were 34 calls for service with 414 for the year of 2020. 6 9-1-1 calls with a total of 68 for the year. Investigations in December included vandalism, threats, suicidal person, driving under suspension and an unattended death. Wangsvick moved and Quamme seconded accepting the report as presented.

Superintendent Mosbrucker shared they spent approx. 70 hours demolishing the building on the 300 block of Brown. The theatre had 6" of water in the basement as their sump pumps had failed. The city helped to get the water pumped out. There was water coming out of the basement of a property on the 300 block of Dakota Ave. The guys were able to get the water shut off at the curb. The City received a compliance letter from the State Health Department about the landfill.

The Binax Covid testing training is available through the State. The Council opted out as District Health will come out and perform testing if requested.

The City is going to offer the recently demolished lots on the 300 block of Brown Avenue up for bid. There needs to be some clarification first. The bids will be published in the newspaper in the near future.

There have been some resident requests to allow shipping containers within the City of Mott. After much discussion the Wangsvick moved and Johnson seconded that no new/additional shipping containers would be allowed with the boundaries of the City of Mott.

There are 3 CDs that have or are going to mature in January. Steiner moved and Wangsvick seconded using \$119,000 of CD 2000206 to pay off the loan on the loader. The remainder of the funds from that CD will be added to CD 2000181 and that CD will be put into a new 5 year CD at 1.25% with multiple step-ups. Johnson moved and J. Messmer seconded rolling CD 2000207 into a new 5 year CD at 1.25% with multiple step-ups.

K. Messmer moved and Steiner seconded designating the Commercial Bank of Mott as the City's depositor.

The server for Channel 93 died shortly after the last meeting. Consolidated will be replacing it at no charge to the City. They hope to have it replaced by the end of January and then the Auditor will go through training.

There was no response to the City's letter requesting Dakota Plains Management clean up the property on the 200 block of Brown Ave. The mayor will follow up with our attorney as to next steps. Sales Tax numbers for 2020 were higher than anticipated.

Moore Engineering sent a preliminary report of their findings including a water distribution map, sanitary sewer collection system map and assessment map of City streets. Next they will get with the City Superintendent to get feedback on the maps and present their findings and options at the March meeting.

The Mayor met with Mandar Nangare from Barr Engineering. Covid has slowed down the Cannonball Dam project. The options remain to replace the dam, modify it or remove it. No final report or recommendations yet, but the project has not been forgotten.

K. Messmer moved and Quamme seconded the purchase of 2 new radios that will trigger the weather sirens. The purchase price with on-site programming is \$2589. The Kelsch foundation has graciously granted the City the money to complete this project.

Superintendent Mosbrucker has been working diligently on getting our landfill in compliance with State regulations. New compost piles and a ramp down into the hole have been put in place. Lift repairs have been required. Dakota Pump has been out to help. Rural water will be in town to help trace a couple of water shut-offs in town, new curb stops will likely be installed.

Wangsvick moved and Johnson seconded the approval of raffle permits for the Mott-Regent Public School, Visionary Committee and the Volunteer Fire Brigade.

Roosevelt-Custer Regional Council will be having a public meeting to answer questions regarding Community Development Block Grants. It is open to the public.

There was an additional question as to how to handle a dog at large. The answer was to call the Sheriff's department.

The Superintendent shared that they have been busy with installing and repairing water shut-offs. Good Samaritan needed a new meter. They tore down and disposed of the trailer the National Guard used when they were here last. The streets are still leaking water but as soon as that stops they plan to do crack sealing and tarring, in the meantime the guys are cleaning the streets in preparation. The landfill has a burn permit but we must wait for the right weather conditions to do the burn.

The Preliminary Engineering report from Moore Engineering reports that the City's infrastructure and street issues can be summarized as follows: <u>Sanitary</u>:83 blocks need sewer relining/replacement and manhole rehab. <u>Water</u>: 15 blocks need replacement of water mains, valves, hydrants and/or service lines. 4 blocks need new water main looping. <u>Street</u>: 19 blocks need reconstruction; 72 blocks of mill and overlay; 2 blocks of alley reconstruction and some ADA sidewalk improvements. The Council was given detailed reports to review. Moore will be at the April Meeting to present info and answer questions.

The Mayor shared he met with a local business owner in regards to questions and concerns that were brought up at the February meeting. The Mayor shared that the City was getting complaints regarding vehicles running for long periods of time, the general state of disorder and accumulation of refuse, and the lack of clean-up when automotive fluids spilled. The business owner understood and shared he would implement a clean-up immediately.

Wangsvick moved and J. Messmer seconded to accept a proposal from Southwest Business Machines for \$1846.00 for a new computer, docking station, monitor, and printer for the City Auditor.
