Tractor & Machinery Safety

OBJECTIVE

Here we introduce the children to the various types of farm machinery & vehicles that are commonly used on a farm and how the farmer must be responsible and safe when using them. Note: In older the groups we delve into more detail on quad bikes.

GETTING STARTED

Ask the children to name different types of farm machinery or vehicles that might be used on farm. Now ask them what each piece of machinery does, the prompt guide below will help you with the discussion.

Write the answers on the board. When tractor is mentioned, underline it - Tractors

We will be discussing tractors in greater detail.

FARM MACHINERY

Tractors - VehicLe PLough Trailer Used on farms to pull equipment such as Digs up the earth to loosen the soil or before Normally pulled by a tractor and used to carry a variety of products around the farm, the farmer sows the next crop in their field. ploughs, harrows, slurry agitators, etc. such as grain and food crops. SLurry/Muck Spreader Combine Harvester - VehicLe Cultivator/Tiller Cuts and harvests grain and cereal crops. Spreads slurry across the farmer's fields. Used after ploughing to break down the soil and prepare it for sowing seed. **SLurry Agitator** Mower Topper A slurry agitator is used to mix (agitate) Cuts grass when making hay, silage, Used to keep fields tidy by cutting weeds and slurry which is kept in the slurry tank/pit. haylage. Can also be used to keep fields tidy. long grasses, rushes, etc.

Blindspots – You cannot be seen

Remind the children never to stand near a moving tractor! Visibility can be limited for farmers when sitting high up in tractors, combine harvesters, etc.

They must **<u>NEVER</u>** play near a moving tractor or any other type of farm machinery as the farmer may not see them. Look at the picture below and note where the blind spots are located.



2 Checklist – all farmers should check the following before using their tractor

- Clean the steps into the cab of mud so no one slips
- Handbrake prevent tractor rolling when on an incline;
- Clean cab floor to avoid the risk of pedals jamming;
- Clean all windows for good visibility;
- Check lights and mirrors for visibility;
- Equipment, such as Power Take Off (PTO) is fitted correctly! the PTO must have a guard and the shaft must be covered.



WHAT TO WEAR

Seat belts - The Safety Zone

Where the farmer sits in a tractor is called the cab. Tractors are very bouncy, so all drivers and passengers should wear a seat belt to keep them safe inside the tractor.

Remind the children about why they wear a seat belt in a car?

Lets not forget to remind the farmers to have their hi vis vests ready to wear when working and driving in their tractors!
