

# Rules and Regulations

## 1. Basic Information

### Eligibility

The contest is open to middle and high school students. Students may submit individual or group entries.

### Entry Deadline

Submissions can be made in advance of Yom Ha'atzmaut (May 14th, 2024) and will be open **till May 24th, 2024**

## 2. Poster Requirements

1. Posters may use any mixed media suitable for reproduction as a poster including computer-generated graphics; no trademarked or copyrighted images or phrases can be used.
2. Posters can also be created with art materials (paper, cloth, paint etc.). In this case, participants are required to upload a good quality image of the physical product.

### Rights

1. The winning posters may be displayed at the National Library of Israel and reproduced on the official National Library of Israel website and social media channels at the sole discretion of the National Library of Israel.
2. The National Library of Israel will assume full ownership of the content.
3. Entry in the contest constitutes full permission to publish the names of winners.
4. The determination of eligibility of entries and any interpretation of these rules is at the sole discretion of the National Library of Israel and is final and binding upon all entrants.
5. By participating, entrants agree to abide by and be bound by these rules.

### Plagiarism

Project entries cannot include plagiarized work. Plagiarism is considered the deliberate copying of someone else's thoughts, ideas, expressions, words, artistic expressions, or scientific work without formally acknowledging its source. Project entries that include plagiarized content will be eliminated from the competition.

### 3. Judging Process

Posters will be judged according to the following criteria:
