# Step 1

Think about your personal connection to Israel.

#### Ask yourself the following questions:

- What role does Israel play in my life?
- What associations does Israel evoke?
- What adjectives describe Israel?
- What do I love most about Israel?
- What colors is Israel associated with?



# Step 2

Organize your ideas. When you decide what you want to express in your design, think about the following parts:














### Shape and form

Shapes can be geometric or free-form. Form is measurable by length, width, and height, and encloses volume.

- What shapes and forms do I want to use in my poster?
- Are they 3-D or flat?





### Color

You can create various effects by placing colors next to each other in different ways. Consider what each color represents or which feelings it can evoke.










- What colors do I want to use in my poster?
- How can I combine these colors?

## Emphasis

Emphasis is the area of an artwork that draws attention. It is often the place a viewer looks first.

- What element should be the main focus of my artwork?
- How can I emphasize it?





## Composition

Composition is the elements' arrangement in the artwork. Don't forget which elements are the main ones and which are secondary.

- Do my elements work together?
- How do they contribute to the artwork's meaning?





### Movement

You can utilize lines, edges, shapes, and colors to point the way through an artwork for our eyes to follow.

Movement creates emotions.

- How can I add the movement to my work?
- What mood do the movement elements create in my poster?





## Unity

Unity is the pleasing combination of elements. Good combinations give a sense of completion.

- Do my poster's colors, shapes and elements work well together?
- What feelings does my work evoke?





# Step 3

The last rule is very important. Remember, YOU are the one creating the poster!

So... Make sure to leave a personal touch and embody ideas that inspire you!
