- Mrs. Goscicki is working out the CTE credit vs the STREAM lab concept. We have two courses that are CTE credit in the STREAM lab, Intro to Information Technology and Computer Programming. Students who want to take a course where they have more freedom to explore are taking a STREAM course that is an elective credit, but not a CTE credit. Mrs. Goscicki has been very creative using our Edgenuity license to help meet some of the State’s requirements for CTE.
- Mrs. Herrick is teaching 2 business classes this semester: Intro to Business and Accounting. Both classes are considered CTE courses
- We have 4 students taking courses at the A-TEC building. One student goes to Presentation for class and we have 7 going to NSU for a class. 23 students are taking 39 online courses from NSU, Black Hills State, USD and Lake Area.
- Students are beginning their Science Fair projects already. This year students can design a science fair project in Engineering in the STREAM lab as well.
- Homecoming Coronation will be Monday, September 16.
