TIM WEISZ:

- We have started the planning phase of what school will look like in the fall. The committee is currently working on multiple scenerios. Committee members include Tim Weisz, Paula Florey, Elizabeth Gorski, Mark Stone, Terry Dosch, Sara Vetch, Jackie Braun. Outside sources will be consulted on an as needed basis.
- The Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) process continues. We are currently finalizing the application process for turning the current loan into a grant. We fully expect to utilize the entire loan amount.
- We are currently fully staffed for the 2020-2021 academic year.
- The Nearly New store remains on hold. We will continue to monitor the current COVID-19 status and make a decision on when to reopen based on the safety of the Nearly New Staff.
- The Roncalli Scrip Program is being phased out. The decision to do so is a financial one. We were not making any profit. The reduction in staff in the development department was also a factor.
- As we close out this year. I would like to personally thank every single ACSS employee. We faced the challenges of this year admirably. Thank the Lord for gifting ACSS with an outstanding staff.

ELIZABETH GORSKI:

- Our final pick-up was a great “cap” to the year. It was well attended, and the weather was perfect. We concluded with a little farewell party for Jayde Sechser, Anita Miller, Deb Dix, and Kristen Dolan as all are leaving our building. Their presence will be missed, but they are all off to great things and are wished the very best!
- Registrations for next year continue to come. We have reached capacity for full-time PK.
- Summer Patch is up and running! The staff has done a wonderful job prepping the school to be a fun, inviting, and safe environment for all. We look forward to having our new OST Director, Ashley Brudvig, join us later this month. Pat Buechler has gone above and beyond to ensure we are following CDC guidelines and every detail has been addressed.

We received a grant from the Department of Health for sun safety gear and will hear from the Department of Childcare services by next week on another grant that was made available as a result of Covid-19.

- I am extremely proud of the staff I got to work with at the Primary this year, they are dedicated and passionate and I learned so much. A new leader is an adjustment, but this group made it very easy! Thank you also, to Paula, Peggy and Tim. They taught me so much about leadership, integrity, and balancing family life! I could not have been more blessed with my first year at Roncalli.

PAULA FLOREY:

- A big THANK YOU goes out to thank Kim Carda for putting together the flash drives of the graduation ceremony and the DVDs of pictures and the senior video. It was definitely a learning process for everyone. I know Dan Unser was a big help with the flash drive copying as well. We had about 25 families who had purchased these.
- Scheduling is almost finished. We will be using NSU Distance Learning for Spanish 2 next year. Students were able to choose if they wanted a completely online course or a blended course which they log into class a specific time 2x a week and actually meet with the teacher and then have online coursework the other 3 days. Spanish 1 will be taught by Mrs. Martinez still in a hybrid format. She will actually be at the High School at least 2 days a week to teach face to face and then will have online class the other 3 days.
- The Regent Universities have decided to change their academic schedule for the fall semester. That will impact our Dual Credit students, but since the majority will take online courses, we will be able to adjust to this. We do have 3 students who are going to NSU's campus and 1 to PC for classes.
- I will be giving 2 tours within the next week to 2 potential high school students.
- Mark Stone and Rich Dix have revised Driver's Ed a bit so that they can allow for more social distancing during the classroom portion. They have divided the students into 2 groups and will do the classroom sessions with each group in different weeks. They have also given the parents options as far as the driving portion goes if they are uncomfortable with the normal format of 2 students and an instructor in the car.
- We will be working on some contingency plans for starting school in case we cannot have a normal start.

RICK KLINE: DEVELOPMENT & MARKETING DIRECTOR

Discussions have started once again about the construction of a practice track facility on the Roncalli High School campus. Our former practice facility is being demolished to make way for a softball complex at Old Swisher Field.

- The Hall of Fame date has been set for Saturday, September 26, 2020. The 2020 inductees include: Academics/Arts—Jeff Hurlbert, Athletics—Cary Hornaman, Benefactor/Founder—Ken and Dee Fielder Family, Employee—Rose Kraft, Volunteer—Todd Zens. Congratulations to all these Roncalli supporters. Our banquet will be held in conjunction with the class of 1975 class reunion.
- The Cavalier Golf Classic will be held Saturday, September 19, 2020 @ Lee Park.
- June 25, 2020 has been selected as the date for the Cavalier Blast. To date, we have 17 confirmed teams.
- The 2020 Roncalli Ball was cancelled. However, through the continued generosity of our supporters, we were able to raise \$65,000 through donations and the Silent Auction through Handbid.
- We will begin meeting with supporters working on our donor menu for 2020-21 year.

TERRY DOSCH/MARK STONE: SPORTS SCHEDULES- NORTHEASTSDCONFERENCE.COM

- The 2019-2020 school year ended much more quietly than any of us preferred. Due to Covid-19, the SDHSAA asked that April and May be quarantined months - no activity for athletics or fine arts practice and competitions.
- Beginning June 1, the SDHSAA has allowed a 3-phase plan to allow students to return to summer practices and workouts. We are following that plan with a few adjustments made specific to ACSS (see attached Summer workout plan designed for ACSS). It will be great to see the students come back into the school building!
- When students enter the building for summer practices and workouts, they are subject to wellness and temperature checks by the coaching staff and daily cleaning is done.
- For the most part, it will be a summer of individual skill development and workouts with limitations and restrictions on team camps and events.
- We are praying and anticipating a “normal” start to the 2020-21 school year and activities. All games and events for the school year are scheduled, officials are hired and opponents are contracted. Some of the schedules have been posted and made public and the others will be coming soon.
- We have contracted with Duenwald busing of Clark for our fall activities (cross country, football and volleyball) until our own bus arrives. We expect to have the new bus in time to use for winter and spring activities.
- We’ve made some adjustments to the required paperwork for students and families to complete prior to participating in athletics. It’s more “user friendly” - less paperwork to

sign and return. The paperwork and concussion testing normally done in August is happening now so we'll be ready to begin when activities resume for the fall.

- Some adjustments and reductions were made to the equipment and personnel budgets for activities for the 2020-21 school year in order to assist with the overall school budget.
- The RES and RPS gym floors have been resurfaced and the RHS gym floor will be done in late July.
