

Barney Street bridge works construction

From Tuesday 8 January 2013, piling works will begin in Barney Street for the new light rail bridge over the Nerang River.

Works will initially involve establishing a platform and positioning a crane and piling rig at the end of Barney Street adjacent to the fishing platform.

What to expect:

- Temporary closure of the fishing platform and fencing of the land next to the existing traffic bridge for approximately six to eight weeks.
- Changed street conditions and the temporary removal of on street parking in Barney Street.
- Piling activity for several weeks to drive four new bridge piles.
- Pedestrian access under the bridge will be maintained. Occasional short term closures will be required for safety during lifting operations.
- Heavy machinery, such as piling and crane movements.
- Construction noise and vibration at times. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts. Strict environmental controls will be in place.
- The majority of construction work will be carried out between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

Night works:

- Some work may be required to be done at night.
- During night works vehicles will use “quacker” (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.
