




## GoldLinQ works in Broadbeach

**From Tuesday October 23 2012, GoldLinQ will start civil construction and track laying along the Gold Coast Highway from St Kilda Avenue to Australia Avenue.**

### Traffic changes:

The majority of construction will take place within the centre median. However to facilitate track laying, intersection closures will occur for approximately two weeks. Affected residents and businesses will receive advanced notice prior to future closures.

Alternative routes and redirections will be signed. Please drive to the conditions at all times during construction as points of access, temporary lane closures and changes to traffic flow will occur.



### What to expect:

- Installation of safety barriers and fencing to contain the construction area.
- Heavy machinery, such as excavation and crane movements to facilitate construction activities.
- Pedestrian access routes will be maintained around the construction area (see map). Temporary footpath closures near the active work area will occur and alternative routes will be signed.
- Construction noise, dust and vibration at times. Every effort will be made to minimise these impacts.
- The majority of construction work will be carried out between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

### Night works:

- Night works will be required as part of these works to minimise the impact on businesses, pedestrians and traffic. Affected businesses and residents will be notified in advance.
- During night works vehicles will use “quacker” (quieter) style reversing alarms to reduce noise.
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.

### About GoldLinQ:

In June 2011 GoldLinQ was awarded the contract to design, build and operate Stage One of the light rail system. In partnership with the State and Federal Government and the Gold Coast City Council, GoldLinQ will deliver a \$1 billion world-class public transport system for the Gold Coast scheduled to commence operations in 2014.
