


## Parklands Drive Precinct

From Tuesday 24 July 2012, GoldlinQ will relocate vital underground services along Parklands Drive. These works are expected to take four weeks to complete, weather permitting.

## Traffic changes:

During these works Entry 1 to Parklands Gold Coast will be closed with all traffic directed to Entry 2. Entry and exit from Parklands will be via left turn only.

Motorists from Smith Street are to drive around the Engineering Drive roundabout and down to Entry 2. Motorists from Olsen Avenue are to drive through the Engineering Drive roundabout and turn left into Entry 2. Pedestrian access will be signed and changed conditions will be under traffic control.



## What to expect:

- The majority of construction work will be carried out between 6:30am and 6:30pm, Monday to Saturday.
- Heavy and minor machinery noise including reversing alarms from 7:00am. Every effort will be made to minimise these
  impacts.
- Installation of safety fencing and traffic barriers to contain the work area.
- Relocation of underground services and storm water drainage works.
- Preliminary signalised intersection works.
- Asphalt, kerb, footpath and landscaping reinstatement.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

## Night works:

- Some night work will be required between 7:00pm and 6:00am, Sunday to Thursday.
- Affected stakeholders will be notified directly about night works impacts. Please sign up to receive SMS or email updates at www.goldling.com.au.
- During night works vehicles will use "quacker" style reversing alarms rather than beepers to reduce noise
- Light towers will be placed to limit glare.
