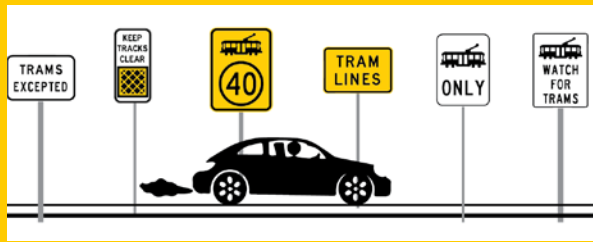

Work commencing 10 February 2014

Parklands

Parklands Drive asphaltting works

From Wednesday 12 to Friday 15 February, [final asphaltting works will occur along Parklands Drive from Smith Street to Engineering Drive](#) between 7:00pm and 5:00am, weather permitting.

Two-way traffic access on Parklands Drive will be maintained under traffic control between Smith Street and Engineering Drive.

Engineering Drive and Alumni Place will be closed to traffic access during these works, with alternative access available via University Drive.

Underground services installation will occur day and night near the bus stops at Engineering Drive. Bus services will not be interrupted.

Kerb, footpath, drainage, landscaping works and tram testing including night works continue.

Southport

Queen Street

From Wardoo Street to Nerang Street

Tram testing continues. Finishing works will occur throughout the week and some night works will be required.

Nerang Street

Between Queen and Davenport Street

Finishing works will occur including some night works and lane closures.

Between Davenport Street and Scarborough Street

Finishing works, paving, landscaping and station works continue including night works.

Scarborough Street

Southport paving and night works

Footpath and landscape works are underway in Southport. The work involves jack-hammering and removing the current pavement, replacing and levelling underground service pit lids and laying a new concrete base and pavers.

Day, night and weekend works will be required to maintain access to businesses and complete work as quickly as possible. Night works will occur between 6:30pm and 6:30am.

Pedestrian detours will be in place. Please follow all directions and signage for safety.

Near Hinze Street

Finishing works will occur including concreting medians, underground services and footpath works.

Between Nerang Street and Queen Street

Footpath demolition and concreting will continue day and night.

Tram testing and landscaping works continue. Do not walk on the tracks, watch for trams and cross at pedestrian crossings.

Scarborough Street night lane closures

The southbound lane of Scarborough Street between Young Street and Queen Street will be closed from 7:00pm to 5:00am Monday to Friday.

Southbound traffic will detour via Young Street, Garden Street and Nerang Street.

The northbound lane of Scarborough Street will remain open with both north and southbound traffic movements between Young Street and Hinze Street under traffic control.

Local access will be maintained and closures will continue for up to 12 weeks during footpath demolition and paving works.

Overhead wires are live and trams are testing in Southport

Overhead power lines are now live in Scarborough Street and tram movements continue.

Trams are currently testing at operational speeds and overhead wires are live from the [Gold Coast University Hospital Station at Parklands Drive to the Broadwater Parklands Station north of the Sundale Bridge](#).

Queen Street

From Scarborough Street to Barney Street

Finishing works including track form kerbs, concrete infills, footpaths and landscaping continues. Lane closures and night works will occur.

Nerang River

Overhead wires are live and trams are testing to Surfers Paradise

Overhead wires are now live in Surfers Paradise from the [Nerang River Bridge to the intersection of Staghorn Avenue and Surfers Paradise Boulevard](#).

Tram testing can be expected to occur at anytime and overhead wires are live from the Gold Coast University Hospital Station at Parklands Drive to Staghorn Avenue, north of the Cypress Avenue Station in Surfers Paradise.

Shared cycle and pedestrian bridge

Piling works continue on the northern side with changes to the pedestrian access on the boardwalk. Girder installation will continue at night with lane closures on the existing traffic bridge.

Light rail bridge

Overhead wires are now live and tram testing will occur at any time. Track finishing and painting will continue.

Nerang River barge movements

The barge Leonora is on the northern side of the river to the east of the traffic bridge. Mariners are advised to use caution. Details are available on the [Maritime Safety Queensland website](#).

Paradise Waters

Gold Coast Highway

From Friday 14 February, final asphaltting works will commence along the Gold Coast Highway from the Sundale Bridge to Admiralty Drive between 6:30pm and 6:30am for up to two weeks, weather permitting.

Single lane closures and detours will be in place to facilitate works, including at Admiralty Drive, Tedder Avenue and Waterways Drive intersections. Traffic and police control will be in place.

Overhead wires are now live and tram testing will occur at any time.

Landscape works continue along Commodore Drive and at the Admiralty Drive intersection. Lane closures and night works will occur. Finishing and station works continue.

From Thursday 13 February, the northbound bus stop on the Gold Coast Highway at Tedder Avenue will be permanently shifted 50 metres south. Services will not be affected.



Surfers Paradise

Traffic changes at Ferny Avenue (Gold Coast Highway)

From Saturday 8 February, the Gold Coast Highway will be reopened to two lanes southbound. Please drive to the conditions.

Surfers Paradise Boulevard will remain open to southbound traffic and a right hand turn from the Gold Coast Highway northbound into Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be opened.



Ferny Avenue to Staghorn Avenue

Overhead wires are now live and tram testing will occur at any time.

Ocean Avenue remains one-way westbound from Surfers Paradise Boulevard to the Gold Coast Highway.

Drainage installation continues along Ocean Avenue between Surfers Paradise Boulevard and the Gold Coast Highway. Lane closures will occur.

Finishing works, including asphaltting, kerbing, footpaths and landscaping continue. Night and weekend works will occur. Station works continue.

Staghorn Avenue to View Avenue

From Tuesday 11 February to Friday 14 February, [Staghorn Avenue east will be closed to all traffic at Surfers Paradise Boulevard.](#)

Finishing works, including asphaltting, kerbing, footpaths and landscaping continue. Night and weekend works will occur. Station works continue.

View Avenue to Elkhorn Avenue

Finishing works, including kerbing, footpaths, paving and landscaping continues. Night and weekend works will occur.

Paving and night works on Surfers Paradise Boulevard from Elkhorn Avenue to Trickett Street

Footpath and landscaping works continue along Surfers Paradise Boulevard between Elkhorn Avenue and Trickett Street. The work involves jack-hammering and removing the current pavement and driveways, replacing and levelling underground service pit lids and laying a concrete base.

Day, night and weekend works will be required to maintain access to businesses and complete work as quickly as possible. Night works will occur between 6:30pm and 6:30am.

Pedestrian detours will be in place. Please follow all directions and signage for safety.

Elkhorn Avenue to Trickett Street

On Monday 10 February from 6:30pm to 6:30am, Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to southbound traffic from Elkhorn Avenue to Cavill Avenue.

On Monday 10 February, night works will occur to upgrade water services at the intersection of Beach Road, Hanlan Street and Surfers Paradise Boulevard.

From Monday 10 February, night works will occur to install underground services and upgrade traffic signals at Elkhorn Avenue intersection and will continue for up to one week.

Footpath and landscaping works continue along the western footpath. Preparatory works for underground service pits and tile removal continue along the eastern footpath. Night and weekend works will occur. Station works continue.

Trickett Street to Hamilton Avenue

From Monday 10 February, finishing works including concrete footpath and landscaping works will commence along the eastern footpath from Trickett Street to Laycock Street. Night and weekend works will occur. Station works continue.

Clifford Street to Thornton Street

Finishing works for underground services, footpaths, landscaping and station works continue.

From Monday 10 February, works to cut-over telecommunications cables will occur at Enderley Avenue and Thornton Street. Continuous works will take place, Monday to Sunday, for up to two weeks.

Surfers Paradise Boulevard asphalting works

From Monday 10 February, [final asphalting works will commence along Surfers Paradise Boulevard from Clifford Street to Vista Street](#) between 6:30pm and 6:30am for up to two weeks, weather permitting.

Surfers Paradise Boulevard will be closed to all southbound traffic each night to facilitate the works including Hamilton Avenue, Markwell Avenue and Enderley Avenue intersections. Local access will be maintained under traffic control.

Surfers Paradise Boulevard will re-open to southbound traffic each morning.

Broadbeach

Gold Coast Highway

Wharf Road to Australia Avenue

Landscaping and station works within the centre median of the Gold Coast Highway continues. Lane closures will occur outside of peak times.

Australia Avenue to Victoria Avenue

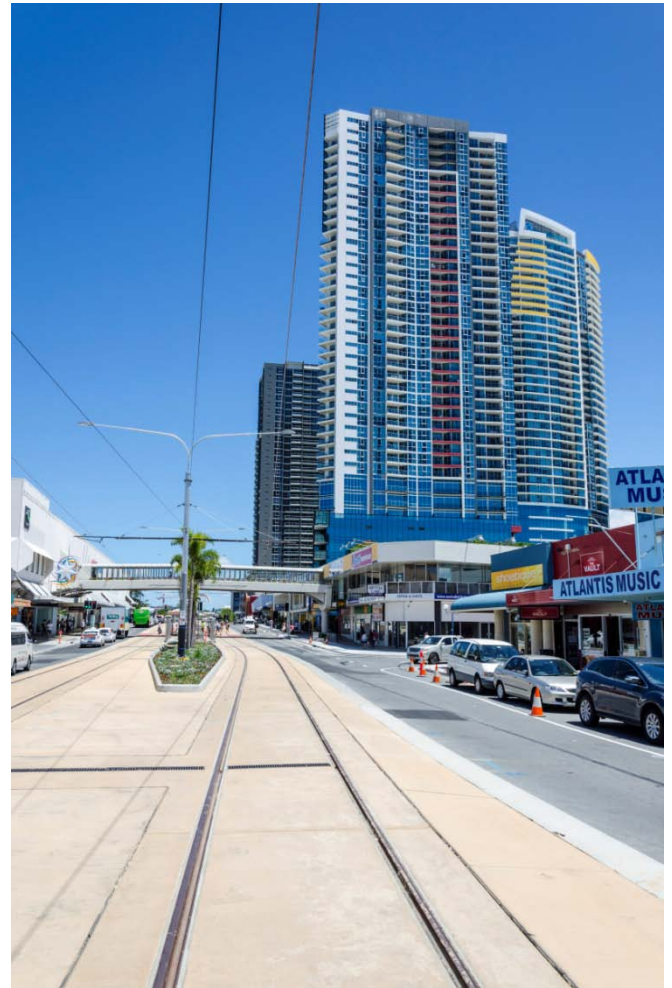
The southbound bus stop on the Gold Coast Highway at Australia Avenue is permanently closed. Passengers should make their way to the closest alternative stop located south on the Gold Coast Highway at the Main Place shops.

Landscaping, footpath, energex and station works continue. Lane closures will occur.

Victoria Avenue to Hooker Boulevard

Footpath, landscaping and underground service works continue.

Traffic signal works will occur at Hooker Boulevard intersection from 3:00pm Sunday 9 February to 6:00am Monday 10 February. The intersection will be managed under police and traffic control.
