Parklands

Underground services

Telstra relocations continue in Parklands Drive along with drainage and earth works near Engineering Drive.

Southport

Scarborough Street works starting soon

Micro tunnelling for a new sewer line is continuing at the Depot site. Earthworks will commence in June.

Traffic signs will be erected prior to works starting on Monday 28 May at:

- Scarborough Street between Hinze and Lawson Streets.
- Nerang Street between Davenport and Scarborough Streets.

Traffic barriers, line marking changes and temporary street lighting will be erected in Scarborough Street at the start of these works.

Paradise Waters

Site preparation

The Gold Coast Highway, between Nerang River Bridge and Admiralty Drive, has been reduced to two-lanes northbound. Bus stops along the highway remain open. Temporary pedestrian walkways have been provided through the site to link Commodore Drive.

Surfers Paradise

Buses re-routed to the Gold Coast Highway

Bus stops along Surfers Paradise Boulevard, Main Beach Parade (south of Breaker Street) and Beach Street servicing routes 750, N750, 21, N21, 740, 745 have now been closed. Alternate bus stops for these services are located nearby on the Gold Coast Highway, Breaker Street and Peninsular Drive. Works to finalise bus stop upgrades on Ferny Avenue will take place at the Ocean Avenue and Palm Avenue bus stops. Single lane closures may occur between 9:00am-3:00pm as part of these upgrades. We apologise for any inconvenience to passengers.

Broadbeach

Traffic changes

Left turn slip lanes from the Gold Coast Highway to TE Peters Drive and Hooker Boulevard have been removed. Traffic signals have been altered to incorporate a left turn signal.

Traffic on the Gold Coast Highway near the Gold Coast Convention Centre now travels along the centre section of roadway. Concrete barriers, fencing and shade cloth will be installed to contain work areas.
