### Parklands

#### Underground services and excavation

Drainage and stormwater works continue in Parklands Drive near Engineering Drive.


Excavation continues within the Depot site, between Olympic Circuit and Baratta Street.

### Southport

#### Night works to establish traffic management

Night works will commence in Queen Street, between Wardoo and Nerang Streets, on Monday 28 May for line marking and the installation of traffic barriers. This is to prepare for the first track laying for the Stage One corridor. During night works vehicles will use "quacker" style reversing alarms rather than beepers to reduce noise. Light towers will be placed to limit glare to nearby residences.

Night works in Scarborough Street will also commence from Monday 28 May for line marking and temporary street lighting in preparation for removing the centre median and vegetation the following week.

### Paradise Waters

#### Site preparation

The Gold Coast Highway, between Nerang River Bridge and Admiralty Drive, has been reduced to two-lanes northbound. Temporary pedestrian walkways have been provided at the bus stops to link Commodore Drive. Further vegetation clearing will take place within the site in the coming weeks.

### Surfers Paradise

#### Potholing outside Chevron Renaissance

Potholing will occur outside Chevron Renaissance at the intersection of the Surfers Paradise Boulevard and Elkhorn Avenue next Monday 28 May between 9:00am and 3:00pm. Single lane closures will occur. Police and traffic control will be in place to assist motorists and pedestrians.

Works to upgrade and install traffic signals at the intersection of Ocean and Ferny Avenues, including excavation and trenching, will occur next week. Single lane closures will occur northbound on Ferny Avenue between 9:00am and 3:00pm, and traffic control will be in place to assist motorists and pedestrians.

Bus stops along Surfers Paradise Boulevard, Main Beach Parade (south of Breaker Street) and Beach Street have now been closed. Alternative bus stops are located nearby on the Gold Coast Highway, Breaker Street and Peninsular Drive. ### Broadbeach

#### Bus stop and earth works

Service investigations will take place outside the Caltex service station at Broadbeach near Pacific Fair in preparation for the previously advised bus stop relocation.

Gravel is being transported and spread to stabilise the earth that has been cleared in Moya Egerton Park. This will prevent soil erosion and minimise dust in the area. Further vegetation clearing will take place within the site in the coming weeks.
