

Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2

SITE PREPARATION & EARTHWORKS – PARKWOOD PARK 'N' RIDE



From late-June 2016, CPB Contractors will start to prepare the land reserved for the Parkwood park 'n' ride facility in readiness for future construction. These works are expected to take several months to complete.

Work in the coming months will include:

- Removal of vegetation and establishment of mulch stockpiles within the project boundary.
- Stripping of topsoil and earthworks to construct level areas for site compounds.
- Earthworks using heavy equipment such as bulldozers, excavators and trucks to grade and level the construction area.
- Transporting cut material using haulage trucks.
- Installation of site drainage.
- Establishment of site facilities including demountable buildings, workforce car park and material laydown areas.

All vegetation removal will be undertaken in accordance with required environmental guidelines. A fauna spotter-catcher will be on-site to survey trees and to monitor for wildlife during clearing.

What to expect

Works will be undertaken between 7:00am and 6:00pm, Monday to Saturday. Workers may arrive onsite between 6.00am and 7.00am to prepare for the day's activities.

During these works, you may notice some changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel.

Some noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery.

Placement of temporary fencing around construction areas.

Every effort will be made to keep disruption to a minimum for residents and businesses in close proximity to the project site. We appreciate your patience during these important works and will continue to update you as work progresses.

Night work – establishment of site access along Smith Street

During the week commencing Monday 27 June 2016, night work will be undertaken along Smith Street, to establish a new site access into the Parkwood park 'n' ride site. This work will be undertaken between 8:00pm and 6:00am each night and is expected to take three nights to complete*.

These works must be undertaken at night when traffic volumes are at their lowest. Traffic control and signage will be in place to assist and direct motorists.

Night work will involve:

- Temporary single lane closure on the westbound carriageway along Smith Street, heading towards Gaven.
- The use of light vehicles, excavator and bobcat to form the new site access point.
- Placement of new line marking to clearly define the site access.
- Using temporary lighting towers to light the work areas.

Every effort will be made to schedule the highest noise generating works to the earlier part of the evenings.

*Should weather delay these activities, they will be undertaken on the next available week night

Project information

Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2 involves the design and construction of a new 7.3km route which runs from Helensvale heavy rail station adjacent to the Gold Coast Line, then adjacent to the Smith Street Motorway to connect with Stage 1 at the Gold Coast University Hospital light rail station.

The Queensland Government and GoldLinQ finalised the Stage 2 Project Documents on 28 April 2016. GoldLinQ's construction contractor CPB Contractors have commenced the detailed design and approvals process and will commence construction in the second half of 2016.

GoldLinQ and CPB Contractors have committed to completing the project in time for the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games.
