



Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2

PROGRESSIVE TEMPORARY LANE CLOSURES AND NIGHT WORKS



From Wednesday 10 August 2016, CPB Contractors will undertake tree clearing, constructing site access points and installing safety barriers, which will involve progressive temporary lane closures on Smith Street, the Smith Street Motorway and Olsen Avenue as well as night works.

Progressive temporary single lane closures along Smith Street, Smith Street Motorway and Olsen Avenue

From Wednesday 10 August 2016, short-term lane closures between 10:00am – 2:00pm weekdays will be required for tree clearing and construction of site access points along Smith Street, Smith Street Motorway and Olsen Avenue for approximately 4 weeks. Lane closures are required to ensure the safety of motorists and construction workers.

Works will involve:

- Progressive temporary short-term single lane closures.
- Traffic control and signage will be in place to assist and direct motorists.
- Clearing of trees along the alignment in close proximity to roads and the motorway.
- Use of hand tools such as chain saws.
- Trucks and machinery including graders, excavators, mulchers and compaction rollers.
- Delivery of material such as gravel for access roads.
- Asphaltting and placement of new line-marking.

*Should weather delay these activities, they will be undertaken on the next available week day.

Night work – lane closures along Smith Street, Smith Street Motorway and Olsen Avenue

From Thursday 11 August 2016, night work will be undertaken along Smith Street, the Smith Street Motorway and Olsen Avenue to progressively install safety barriers. **This work will be undertaken between 8:00pm and 6:00am week nights and is expected to take up to 3 weeks to complete***.

These works must be undertaken at night when traffic volumes are at their lowest. Traffic control and signage will be in place to assist and direct motorists.

Night work will involve:

- **Smith Street** (refer to red line on the map overleaf) - temporary **long-term** lane closure of the eastbound left-hand lane along Smith Street for safety barrier installation. Once barriers are installed, this traffic configuration will remain in place for the duration of the project to provide a safe work area. One lane will remain open to traffic.
- **Smith Street Motorway** (refer to blue line on the map overleaf) - temporary lane closure on the eastbound left-hand lane along Smith Street Motorway for safety barrier installation. One lane will remain open to traffic.
- **Olsen Avenue** (refer to blue line on map overleaf) – temporary lane closure of the northbound left-hand lane along Olsen Avenue for safety barrier installation.
- Traffic control and signage will be in place to assist and direct motorists.
- The use of light vehicles, trucks and cranes.
- Unloading of safety barriers.
- Temporary lighting in the work areas.

Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2 involves the design and construction of a new 7.3km route which runs from Helensvale heavy rail station adjacent to the Gold Coast Line, then adjacent to the Smith Street Motorway to connect with Stage 1 at the Gold Coast University Hospital light rail station.

GoldLinQ's construction contractor CPB Contractors commenced construction in July 2016 and are committed to completing the project in time for the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games.
