Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2

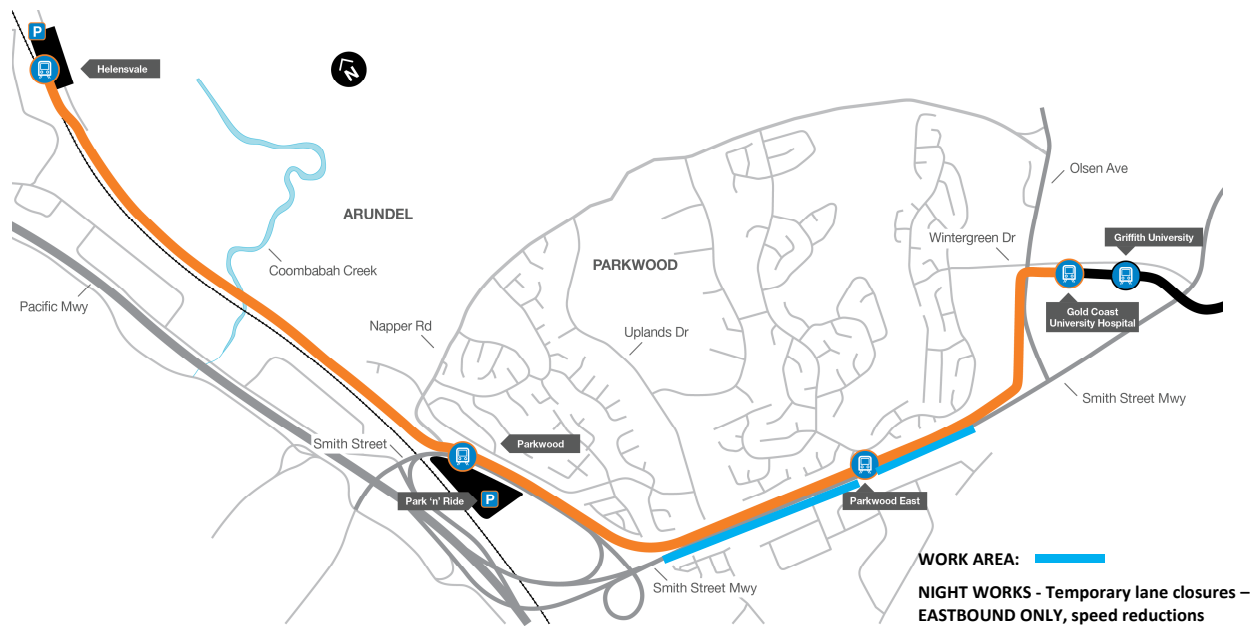
DAY & NIGHT WORKS - TEMPORARY LANE CLOSURES, SPEED REDUCTIONS
EASTBOUND - SMITH STREET MOTORWAY, PARKWOOD

From early October, day and night works, temporary eastbound lane closures and speed reductions are required to complete finishing works and asphaltting along the Smith Street Motorway and connect it to the newly constructed concrete kerbing.

To undertake this work, a road profiling machine must be used at night when traffic volumes are at their lowest.

Road profiling is the process of removing the surface of a road to prepare for a new layer of asphalt to be laid and in this instance, **will take approximately two weeks**.

Road profiling machines can be noisy. Every effort will be made to keep noise at a minimum.



What to expect

- Intermittent temporary lane closures **between 10.00am and 4.00pm weekdays (left lane only) and 8.00pm and 6.00am (two lanes as required) Sunday to Friday during October.**
- **During these works, the speed limit will be lowered to 60km/h for the safety of motorists and construction workers.**
- Traffic control vehicles and signage to support the lane closures and speed reductions.
- Motorists should expect delays or seek an alternative route.

Please note:

- Weekdays between 6:00am to 10:00am and 4:00pm to 8:00pm, all eastbound lanes on the Smith Street Motorway will remain open with an 80km/h speed limit to allow for normal peak hour traffic movements and to assist with minimising disruption.
- These works do not impact any of the westbound lanes of the Smith Street Motorway heading to the M1.

Work will involve:

- Profiling of the road surface from early October for approximately 2 weeks at night.
- Placing final layer of asphalt, installation of signage, concrete barrier 'toppers' and line marking throughout October.
- Trucks and machinery including a road profiler, compaction roller, and large asphalting equipment.
- Visual message boards will operate in the area to keep motorists informed.
- Using temporary lighting towers to light the work areas at night.
