****COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS WILL BE IN PLACE AS PER THE RULES OF THE CLINTON COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS AND NEW YORK STATE****

- RULES:**
1. Show is conducted under USEF rules unless otherwise stated.
 2. For Show purposes, the age of the individual on Jan. 1st shall be maintained throughout the year.
 3. Ponies are 14.2 hands and under and may be shown by exhibitors of any age. Suitability of rider to mount will be considered by the judge. Horses and ponies will show together unless otherwise stated. Miniature Equines are in their own division.
 4. A copy of a **negative Coggins Test must be on file at barn office before horses are unloaded.** NY resident horses- within 2 years; out of NY within one year. Copy becomes property of the Show.
 5. A copy of a **Rabies Vaccination Certificate** from a Veterinarian within the last 12 months must accompany entry. Copy becomes property of the Show.
 6. Any entry into classes for registered horses must submit a copy of the registration papers to the show secretary. Copy becomes property of the Show.
 7. All entry and stall fees (less the office fee) will be refunded upon request before 5:00 pm on Friday, May 28, 2021. **After that time, NO REFUNDS will be given without a veterinarian's certificate** or bona- fide casualty to exhibitor or family- must have proof to the office by 4pm on Sunday, May 30. No classes may be switched after 5:00 p.m. on Friday; classes may be added (entry fee must be paid) or dropped (with no refund). **Entries must be received by the end of the session prior to the class.**
 8. An Office Fee of \$10.00 is charged per horse. This is non-refundable.
 9. All numbers will be assigned to exhibitors by the Show secretary.
 10. Stalls are assigned by the show management. Stalls will be assigned on a first paid, first served basis. Stall cleaning is included in the fee; there is no deposit required. **NO stalls will be reserved without paid entry.** If you have stabling preferences, please state these on the entry

form; we will do our best to accommodate. **All horses staying overnight must be stabled. Barns will not open until 3:00 p.m. on Friday. All horses must be off the grounds by 8:00 p.m. on Sun. If unable to leave by this time, permission from show management to stay is required.**

11. One tack stall may be reserved for a minimum of 2 horses; if you are sharing a tack stall or wish to be stabled as a group, these entries must be received together. Additional tack stalls may be available show weekend.
12. Parking areas will be well defined, please restrict parking to these areas.
13. Dogs must be on a leash at **all** times and must have proof of current Rabies vaccination.
14. The ring will be closed on Friday and Saturday nights from 11:00 p.m. - 5:00 a.m.
Barn lights will be turned off at 11pm.

ZERO TOLERANCE FOR SMOKING IN THE BARN!

15. Use of the track will be limited during infield show times. Galloping is forbidden at all times.
16. Horses are shown at owner's risk. The Show Committee, members of the CVMHA, show officials, and volunteers assume NO responsibility for damage or illness to horses, riders, vehicles or any articles sent to show. Exhibitors and owners must sign entry waiver form.
17. **ASTM approved headgear with harnesses secured is required for: all over fences exhibitors (even while schooling), junior exhibitors, and all exhibitors in Walk/Trot and Beginner classes while participating in show classes and anywhere on the competition grounds.** Any rider violating this rule will immediately be prohibited from further riding/driving until his/her headgear is properly in place.
18. Camper Hook-Ups are \$25.00 **per night** and must be in the designated camper area. **Barn electricity may not be used for campers.** Campers may not be hooked up before Friday, May 26th at 3:00 p.m.
19. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or split classes. In the event of cancellation, entries to that class will be refunded. **Riders cross enter dressage and main ring classes at their own risk.** Efforts will be made to accommodate entries, but you may miss classes without refunds. *Schedule wisely!*
20. All decisions of the judges are final. Complaints must be addressed to show management. Exhibitors of poor sportsmanship, abuse, cruelty to a horse, or violations of the rules will be asked to leave the fairgrounds and will forfeit all entry fees, trophies, prize money and ribbons.

PRIZES: Trophy and six ribbons for each class. Prize money in classes as noted in Class Descriptions. Championship and High Point Awards.

Directions to Clinton County Fairgrounds: Located off Route 22B at 84 Fairgrounds Rd, Plattsburgh, NY 12901. From I-87, take exit 37. Travel west on Route 3. At Route 3 and 22B junction, continue straight (Rte. 3 bears right). Fairgrounds Rd is approximately ¼ mile on the left, across from an elementary school.

Helpful definitions:

Junior Exhibitor: Rider is 18 years old and under.

Youth: Rider is 21 years old and under.

Maiden (horse or rider/driver): Never won a blue ribbon in this division, excluding 4-H.

Novice (horse or rider/driver): Hasn't won 3 blue ribbons in this division, excluding 4-H.

Junior Horse: 5 years old or younger; 2017 show- horse born in 2012 or after is a junior horse.

OPEN SHOW CLASS EXPLANATIONS

ARENA EQUITATION DIVISION: No stallions, except Adult Equitation. All classes to be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of the horse. Patterns may be asked at the discretion of the judge.

39: JUNIOR ENGLISH EQUITATION-RIDER 13 & UNDER Show at the walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring.

40: SENIOR ENGLISH EQUITATION-RIDER 14-18

41: ADULT ENGLISH EQUITATION-19 & over

54: BAREBACK EQUITATION, ENGLISH & WESTERN Open to horses and ponies. To be shown at the walk, trot/jog and canter/lope both ways of the ring. Pattern may be asked at the discretion of the judge. No chaps allowed

93: JUNIOR WESTERN HORSEMANSHIP-Rider 13 & under. To be shown at the walk, jog and lope, both ways of the ring. Pattern may be asked at the discretion of the judge.

94: SENIOR WESTERN HORSEMANSHIP-Rider 14-18.

95: ADULT WESTERN HORSEMANSHIP-Adult 19 & over.

MORGAN DIVISION: Horses shown in this division must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Association, Inc. or The Canadian Morgan Horse Club or if under one year of age, be eligible for registration. Copy of Registration papers must accompany entry.

MORGANS IN HAND:

Entries are judged individually, standing, then at a walk and trot on the line and must be serviceably sound. Emphasis shall be on type and conformation with consideration given to horse's ability to move correctly on the lead. Not more than two handlers, each of whom may have one whip, not to exceed six feet, shall be allowed in the ring to show each horse.

6: MORGAN IN HAND- 2 YRS. & UNDER

8: MORGAN IN HAND- MARES, 3 YRS. & OVER

10: MORGAN IN HAND- STALLIONS AND GELDINGS, 3 YRS. & OVER

12: JUSTIN MORGAN STANDARD (in-hand class) Open to Morgans of any age or sex, not to exceed 15.1 hands. One handler only without a whip to lead entry into the ring, single file at a walk. Entries may be jogged at the judge's request. Judged on the closest resemblance to Justin Morgan as exemplified by the original George Ford Morris portrait and/or the statue at Weybridge, VT.

16: MORGAN HUNTER & MORGAN ENGLISH PLEASURE, LIMIT HORSE Open to horses that have not won 6 blue ribbons (excluding 4H) in this division. To be shown at a walk, trot, extended/road trot, canter, with light rein but still maintaining contact with horse's mouth. Judged on performance, manners, & soundness (60%); type and conformation (40%). Huntseat or saddleseat attire required.

43: MORGAN LADIES HUNTER & ENGLISH PLEASURE Ladies may not ride stallions.

56: MORGAN PLEASURE DRIVING –CARRIAGE & SHOW To be shown at the walk, pleasure trot and road trot both ways of the ring. May be asked to back. Judged on performance, manners, & soundness (60%); type and conformation (40%).

66: MORGAN HUNTER PLEASURE & ENGLISH PLEASURE

74: MORGAN PLEASURE-JUNIOR HORSE Tack Optional. Open to Morgans 5 yrs. & under. Judged at the walk, jog/trot, lope/canter both ways of the ring. Judge may ask for extension at any gait.

83: MORGAN PLEASURE-YOUTH TO RIDE Rider must be 21 years of age or younger. Seat optional.

97: MORGAN WESTERN PLEASURE Show at a walk, jog, and lope with light rein, but still maintaining light contact with horse's mouth. Judge may ask for extension at any gait. Judged on manners, performance, quality and apparent ability to give a good pleasure ride (60%); type and conformation (40%).

OTHER REGISTERED BREED CLASSES: Copy of registration papers must accompany entry.

ENGLISH PLEASURE DIVISION: No martingales, dropped nosebands or tie downs permitted. To be judged on manners and performance. Judged at the walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. Judge may ask for extension at any gait. May be asked to back.

14. NYSHC ENGLISH PLEASURE WIN-A-MEMBERSHIP Open to all horses and ponies. Winner to receive a gift 2021 membership to the New York State Horse Council.

17: ENGLISH PLEASURE, LIMIT HORSE Open to all horses and ponies normally used for pleasure, who have not won SIX blue ribbons at a show (excluding 4-H shows).

42: OPEN ENGLISH PLEASURE Open to all horses and ponies.

62: HUNTER PLEASURE To be shown in hunter style equipment. Mane and tail may be braided or not. Horses may be asked to hand gallop, but no more than 8 horses at a time (excessive speed to be penalized). Must work on a light rein and stand quietly.

63: ENGLISH PLEASURE, LIMIT RIDER Open to all riders who have not won SIX blue ribbons at a show (excluding 4-H).

64: ENGLISH PLEASURE, JUNIOR HORSE Open to all horses and ponies 5 years and under.

65: PONY ENGLISH PLEASURE Open to ponies 14.2 hands and under. Rider may be of any age.

67: JUNIOR ENGLISH PLEASURE-RIDER 13 & UNDER

68: SENIOR ENGLISH PLEASURE-RIDER 14-18

69: ADULT ENGLISH PLEASURE- 19 & over

70: SADDLESEAT PLEASURE OPEN To be shown at a walk, trot, road trot, and canter, both ways of the ring. Judged on performance, presence, quality and manners. Saddleseat equipment and attire is required.

71: ENGLISH PLEASURE, MAIDEN HORSE Open to all horses and ponies normally used for pleasure, who have not won one blue ribbon at a show (excluding 4-H shows).

72: LADIES ENGLISH PLEASURE Open to all horses and ponies except stallions. To be shown at the walk, trot, and canter, both ways of the ring. Judged on manners and suitability as a ladies' mount.

77: ENGLISH PLEASURE CHAMPIONSHIP – Open to the 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place horses from all English Pleasure classes, including breed specific, preceding this one on the schedule. Championship & Reserve ribbons plus 3-6th place.

WESTERN PLEASURE DIVISION: No martingales, dropped nosebands or tie downs permitted. Judged on manners and performance. Judged at the walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring on a light rein without undue restraint. Judge may ask for extensions at any gait or to back.

46. NYSHC WESTERN PLEASURE WIN-A-MEMBERSHIP Open to all horses and ponies. Winner to receive a gift 2021 membership to the New York State Horse Council.

48: WESTERN PLEASURE, LIMIT HORSE Open to all horses and ponies normally used for pleasure, who have not won SIX blue ribbon at a show (excluding 4-H).

51: OPEN WESTERN PLEASURE Open to all horses and ponies.

90: LADIES' WESTERN PLEASURE Open to all horses and ponies except stallions. Judged on manners and suitability as a ladies' mount.

91: PONY WESTERN PLEASURE Open to ponies 14.2 hands and under. Rider may be any age.

92: WESTERN PLEASURE, JUNIOR HORSE Open to horses and ponies 5 years old and under. May show with two hands in a hackamore, bosal or ring snaffle; curb bits allow only one hand.

96: WESTERN PLEASURE-MAIDEN RIDER Open to riders who have not won ONE blue ribbon at a show (excluding 4-H).

98: JUNIOR WESTERN PLEASURE-RIDER 13 YRS. & UNDER

99: SENIOR WESTERN PLEASURE-RIDER 14-18 YRS.

100: ADULT WESTERN PLEASURE- 19 & over

101: WESTERN PLEASURE, MAIDEN HORSE Open to all horses and ponies normally used for pleasure, who have not won one blue ribbon at a show (excluding 4-H).

102: WESTERN PLEASURE CHAMPIONSHIP *No Entry Fee!* Open to the 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place horses from all Western Pleasure classes, including breed specific, preceding this one on the schedule. Championship & Reserve ribbons plus 3-6th place.

OVER FENCES DIVISION: Open to all horses and ponies. Judged on performance & soundness with emphasis on manners. Extreme speed to be penalized. Courses will be posted. Jump heights listed are the maximum. Practice jumps will be provided; schooling the course is not permitted. Equitation over fences descriptions are in the equitation section. Classes to be held on the open, grass hunt field ***ALL over fences riders MUST wear ASTM/SEI approved headgear.***

26: PEE WEE HUNTER (Cross-rails) Judged over a course of max. 8 cross-rails. May not show in other over fences classes in this division.

27: HUNTER OVER FENCES 2'0"

28: SHORT-STIRRUP HUNTER OVER FENCES (2'0") Rider must be 12yo or under.

29: SHORT-STIRRUP QUITATION OVER FENCES (2'0"), Riders 12 & under.

30: PONY HUNTER OVER FENCES (2'0") Open to ponies 14.2h and under, rider of any age.

31: LOW HUNTER OVER FENCES (2'3")

32: LOW HANDY HUNTER OVER FENCES (2'3") To be shown over a course of 8-12 fences. May include a combination, changes of direction, 1 trot fence, 1 lead-over fence (max. 18").

33: REGULAR HUNTER OVER FENCES (2'6")

34: REGULAR HANDY HUNTER OVER FENCES (2'6") To be shown over a course of 8-12 fences. May include a combination, changes of direction, 1 trot fence, 1 lead-over fence (max. 18").

35: OPEN HUNTER UNDER SADDLE Shown at walk, trot, canter. Will not be asked to hand gallop.

36: EQUITATION OVER FENCES, OPEN Open to horses and ponies. To be shown over a course of fences not to exceed 2'6".

37: WORKING HUNTER OVER FENCES (2'9")

38: GAMBLER'S CHOICE Rider MUST have competed in 2'6" class to be eligible. Each jump will be assigned a point value. Each jump may only be taken twice. May take jump from either direction. If knocked down, the jump is "dead". This is a timed event: Rider will have a time limit (TBA day of show).

SHOWMANSHIP DIVISION:

1: ADULT SHOWMANSHIP, 19 & OVER To be shown in hand with the following points considered: (1) appearance of the horse 40% (2) appearance of the exhibitor 10% (3) ability to show the horse in the ring 50%. May be shown English or Western. Patterns at the discretion of judge- to be announced if patterns are to be used and then posted.

2: SENIOR SHOWMANSHIP, 14-18 YEARS OLD Same as Class #1. Not for Novice or Beginner Riders.

3: JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP, 13 & UNDER Same as Class #1. Not for Novice or Beginner Riders.

4: BEGINNER RIDER SHOWMANSHIP Same as Class #1. For exhibitors in the Beginner division, any age.

5: WALK/TROT SHOWMANSHIP Same as Class #1. For exhibitors in the Walk/Trot Rider division, 12 & under.

MISCELLANEOUS HALTER, LUNGE LINE & YOUNG HORSE CLASSES:

7: PONY HALTER Open to all ponies 14.2 hands and under. Miniature horses are excluded. Handlers may be any age.

9: OPEN HALTER - ENGLISH HORSE & PONY Open to all horses & ponies. To be shown at walk and trot. To be judged on conformation, manners, soundness & English horse type.

60: OPEN YEARLING & TWO-YEAR OLD HALTER Open to all horses and ponies, 2 years old and under. To be shown at walk and trot, judged on conformation, soundness, and manners.

61: OPEN HALTER – WESTERN HORSE & PONY Open to all horses & ponies. To be shown at walk and jog. To be judged on conformation, manners, and western or stock horse type. Western attire, including western hat and boots required.

81: LUNGE LINE FOR YEARLINGS AND TWO YEAR OLDS. Open to all breeds.

LEADLINE, WALK/TROT/JOG & BEGINNER RIDER DIVISION: ASTM/SEI certified helmets are **REQUIRED** for **ALL** riders.

18: WALK/TROT ENGLISH EQUITATION Open to riders 12 and under. To be shown at the walk and trot, both ways of the ring. Riders not eligible to show outside Walk/Trot or Introductory Dressage Tests. No stallions. Horses must be at least 4 years old.

19: BEGINNER RIDER ENGLISH EQUITATION Open to any age rider. To be shown at the walk, trot, and riders will be offered the chance to canter individually, unjudged. Riders not eligible to show outside Beginner or Introductory Dressage Tests. No stallions. Horses must be at least 4 years old. Class to be split by age if entries merit.

20: WALK/TROT ENGLISH PLEASURE Open to riders 12 and under. To show at the walk and trot, both ways of the ring. Riders not eligible for other performance classes other than Walk/Trot and Introductory Dressage Tests. No stallions. Horses must be at least 4 years old.

21: BEGINNER RIDER ENGLISH PLEASURE Open to any age rider. To show at the walk, trot, and riders will be offered the chance to canter individually, unjudged. No stallions. Horses must be at least 4 years old. Riders not eligible for other performance classes other than Beginner and Introductory Dressage Tests. Class to be split by age if entries merit.

22: WALK/TROT ENGLISH COMMAND Open to riders 12 and under. Riders not eligible for other performance classes other than Walk/Trot and Introductory Dressage Tests. No stallions. Horses must be at least 4 years old.

23: BEGINNER RIDER ENGLISH COMMAND Open to riders of any age. Will NOT be asked to canter. No stallions. Horses must be at least 4 years old. Riders not eligible for other performance classes other than Beginner and Introductory Dressage Tests. Class to be split by age if entries merit.

24: LEADLINE EQUITATION Open to riders 10 yrs. & under, not showing in any other class except #30. Tack optional. Mounts to be led by adult at least 18 years old. Judged on hands, seat and attitude. **ASTM/SEI certified helmets are REQUIRED for ALL riders.**

25: LEADLINE EGG & SPOON Open to riders 10 yrs. & under, not showing in any other class except #24. Tack optional. Mounts to be led by adult at least 18 years old.. **ASTM/SEI certified helmets are REQUIRED for ALL riders.**

84: WALK/JOG WESTERN HORSEMANSHIP Open to riders 12 and under. To be shown at the walk and jog, both ways of the ring. Riders not eligible to show outside Walk/Jog or Introductory Dressage Tests. No stallions. Horses must be at least 4 years old.

85: BEGINNER RIDER WESTERN HORSEMANSHIP Open to riders of any age. To be shown at the walk, jog, and riders will offered the chance to lope individually, unjudged. Riders not eligible to show outside the Beginner or Introductory Dressage Tests. No stallions. Horses must be at least 4 years old. Class to be split by age if entries merit.

86: WALK/JOG WESTERN PLEASURE Open to riders of any age. To show at the walk and jog, both ways of the ring. Riders not eligible for other performance classes other than Walk Trot and Introductory Dressage Tests. No stallions. Horses must be at least 4 years old.

87: BEGINNER RIDER WESTERN PLEASURE Open to riders of any age. To show at the walk, jog, and riders will be offered the chance to lope individually, unjudged. No stallions. Horses must be at least 4 years old. Riders not eligible for other performance classes other than Beginner and Introductory Dressage Tests. Class to be split by age if entries merit.

88: WALK/JOG WESTERN COMMAND Open to riders 12 and under. Riders not eligible for other performance classes other than Walk/Jog and Introductory Dressage Tests. No stallions. Horses must be at least 4 years old.

89: BEGINNER RIDER WESTERN COMMAND Open to riders of any age. Will NOT be asked to lope. No stallions. Horses must be at least 4 years old. Riders not eligible for other performance classes other than Beginner and Introductory Dressage Tests. Class to be split by age if entries merit.

TRAIL:

Trail horses are required to work over and through obstacles. No horse may enter the trail course area until the course and the judge are ready. Riders will be permitted to inspect the course on foot prior to the start of the class; patterns to be posted. Tests which may be required are negotiating gate, carrying objects from one part of arena to another, over logs or simulated brush, a mailbox, crossing a bridge, backing through obstacles, sidepassing, and performing over any reasonable conditions encountered along the trail. Will be asked to perform gaits appropriate for the class level. Course to include a minimum of six obstacles. Two or more horses may be entered by the same exhibitor and the same rider may elect to show more than one horse depending on class eligibility. Tack optional, except in ARHA Trail- western only.

103: OPEN IN-HAND TRAIL: Open to all horses and ponies. To be lead by one handler through the course.

104: WALK/TROT TRAIL: Open to riders 12 & under eligible to compete in the Walk/Trot division. Horses and ponies to walk and trot/jog only.

105: BEGINNER RIDER TRAIL: Open to any age rider eligible to compete in the Beginner Rider division. Horses and ponies to walk and trot/jog only.

106: JUNIOR RIDER TRAIL: Open to riders 13& under.

107: SENIOR RIDER TRAIL: Open to riders 14-18 years.

108: ADULT TRAIL: Open to riders 19& over.

109: ARHA TRAIL (see description with American Ranch Horse Association division)

MISCELLANEOUS CLASSES:

13: PLEASURE DRIVING, MAIDEN HORSE, CARRIAGE OR SHOW Open to horses and ponies that have never won a blue ribbon in a driving class. No miniatures. For Carriage and Show Pleasure Driving. To show at the walk, pleasure trot, and road trot. Headers allowed for ALL horses.

47: PLEASURE DRIVING, CARRIAGE OR SHOW Open to horses and ponies. No miniatures. To show at the walk, pleasure trot, and road trot.

52: MINT JULEP CLASS English or Western, horses and ponies. All riders start with a plastic glass filled with equal amounts of water to be held in one hand by the stem while riding a class called by the judge at the walk, trot/jog, canter/lope. Winner determined by the rider with the most water left in the glass at class end.

53: EGG AND SPOON Tack optional. Riders will be given a spoon to balance an egg. Horses may be asked to walk, trot/jog, canter/lope, halt and back. NO THUMBS allowed on the eggs! Horses will be called into the center of the ring as eggs are lost. The last egg on spoon is the winner.

55: SIT-A-BUCK English or Western bareback. No chaps allowed. Riders have a dollar bill placed under their thigh by show official. May be asked to walk, trot/jog, canter/lope and halt. Horses called into the center of the ring as paper pieces are lost. The last rider with their dollar is the winner and collects all the dollars from the class!

73: HUNTER HACK Judged at a walk, trot and canter, both ways of the ring. Extended trot and hand gallop may be asked. No more than 8 horses will asked to hand gallop at the same time. Horses will jump two jumps, 36' apart with a maximum height of 2'3". May be asked to back. Rail work 50%, jumps 50%.

75: ROAD HACK A Road Hack is a speedy road horse, used under saddle on a light rein. Show at a walk, trot, road trot, canter and hand gallop, with the ability to move on if required. Excessive speed penalized. No more than 8 horses will hand gallop at a time. Stand quietly and back readily. Must be able to change from any gait to a flat-footed walk at the judge's command. Shown under English tack; martingales and drop nosebands not permitted. Judged on performance, manners, and suitability for a road hack, substance and conformation.

78: GREEN HORSE: WALK TROT PLEASURE English or Western. Open to horses and ponies of any age. To show at the walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Judged on performance and apparent ability to give a good pleasure ride. Horse may NOT show in any other riding class except Intro. Dressage.

79: OPEN COMMAND CLASS Tack optional. Judge will specify elimination methods. The command "reverse" will not be given alone. The command must be "reverse" and (gait named) or "reverse and halt". If a reverse and lope is requested, judge will specify whether riders are to change leads or remain on the same lead.

80: GREEN HORSE: WALK TROT EQUITATION English or Western. Open to horses and ponies of any age. To show at the walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. To be judged on the rider's seat, hands and control of the horse. Pattern at the discretion of the judge. Horse may NOT show in any other riding class except Intro. Dressage.

82: COSTUME CLASS Open to horses & ponies. Horses/ponies may be on a lead or be ridden. Adults may lead horses for riders under 10. Shown at the walk. Safety is the highest priority. To be judged on originality and quality of costume. **ASTM/SEI certified helmets are REQUIRED for ALL riders 17 & under and any riders who showed in the beginner division.**

AMERICAN RANCH HORSE ASSOCIATION DIVISION

11: ARHA SHOWMANSHIP To be judged on the exhibitor's ability to fit and show a conformation horse. Pattern to be posted.

44: ARHA RANCH RIDING To be shown at the walk, jog and lope both directions of the ring. Extended walk and jog may be asked for.

46: ARHA HORSEMANSHIP To be judged on the exhibitor's ability to smoothly execute the required gaits on the rail and in a pattern.

109: ARHA TRAIL

DRESSAGE DIVISION- PRE-ENTRY REQUIRED. RIDE TIMES WILL BE ASSIGNED AND EMAILED TO COMPETITORS BY FRIDAY BEFORE THE SHOW. CLASSES OFFERING TEST OF CHOICE MAY BE ENTERED MORE THAN ONCE TO RIDE DIFFERENT TESTS. WARM UP AREA AND ARENA ON GRASS. ALL TESTS WILL BE RIDDEN IN 20 X 40 METER ARENA EXCEPT: FIRST LEVEL, SECOND LEVEL, AND WDAA LEVEL 1 TO BE RIDDEN IN A 20 X 60 METER ARENA.
