The Pleasure Point area of Cape Cod is historically one of the largest oyster fisheries in Massachusetts. Pleasure Point Oysters are known for easy-opening "restaurant ready" oysters packed in 100-count bags or boxes. A state-of-the-art oyster cleaning and packing system is utilized to ensure a consistent manicured product. Pleasure Point Oysters are produced by a vertically integrated producer from hatchery to finished product.

The oysters themselves are packed in a 3rd party audited facility and the product is handled quickly under strict HAACP guidelines to ensure freshness and quality to the end user. **Pleasure Point Oysters are available for the month of February.**

Valentine's Day has origins in the Roman festival of Lupercalia, held in mid-February.
