PROJECT HISTORY


- Long Range Transportation Plans (2003 & 2019)
 - Identified need for improved east/west connectivity in South Harrison County
 - Identified Watson Road Project as Major Transportation Improvement Need
- February 2020 Relinquishment Agreement
 - Conversations w/ INDOT Seymour District over several years
 - INDOT fund environmental study, design, acquisition and construction of SR 11 extension
 - County taking over maintenance of 31 miles of low-volume state highway facilities (portions of SR 111, SR 11, and SR 337)

 Western extension of SR 11 from the intersection of SR 337, SR 11, and Melview Road to SR 135 in South Harrison County












TYPICAL SECTION












PROJECT TIMELINE












PROJECT DEVELOPMENT PROCESS

- First meeting in early September 2021










ONGOING EFFORTS

- Environmental Studies
 - Karst Investigation caves, sinkholes, underground water systems, etc.
 - Wetlands Investigation
 - Forested Areas
 - Historic Properties
 - Archaeological Research









ONGOING EFFORTS

- Preliminary Engineering
 - Establish preliminary alternatives based on field investigations
 - Survey information
 - Geotechnical analysis
 - Typical sections& design speeds









DRAFT PURPOSE & NEED

NEED

- Improve safety, mobility and accessibility in southern Harrison County
 - Safety Concerns: Hilly, narrow, and often winding roadways with multiple 90-degree turns and poor vertical alignments (grade challenges and site distance issues)
 - Transport of agricultural commodities to markets (primarily to the south) is challenged by limited adequate facilities in the southern part of the county
 - Need improved access to schools and recreational opportunities in southern part of county
 - Current roadway network challenges emergency response efforts, especially as it relates to larger events requiring support from multiple groups









DRAFT PURPOSE & NEED

PURPOSE

- Provide safer, more direct east/west connectivity in southern Harrison County
 - Provide east/west state highway facility connection that meets current design standards
 - Improve regional connectivity for movement of agricultural commodities to market
 - Improve regional traffic safety in southern Harrison County
 - Improve accessibility for school traffic by providing more direct route and new bridge crossing of Buck Creek
 - Improve accessibility to public facilities (park and golf course)
 - Improve access from SR 337/SR 11 to SR 135 to support future development potential in southern Harrison County
