REFLECTION

Thursday of this week will see the annual commemoration of Remembrance Day. We will be acknowledging and celebrating the very real virtue of sacrifice – and, in particular, the self-sacrifice of every single man and woman who have died in armed conflict since 1914. This commemoration sits in perfectly with this weekend's Gospel, centering as it does on the widow who had two coins in her purse. Together they amounted to a really insignificant amount. Both coins together were no more than a penny and she gave them both. It would have been understandable had she kept one for herself. But, no! she gave both, everything she had in her purse. Jesus gives his approbation: *I tell you solemnly, this poor widow has put in more than all who have contributed to the treasury.*

I always start thinking about these 'reflections' at the beginning of the week and the widow has been uppermost in my mind as I have watched some of the COP26 discussions. The pessimist in me says we are witnessing the terminal decline of Planet Earth – and the optimist found immense hope as I listened to Vinishi Urmashankar as she addressed the World Leaders and delegates gathered for the Conference. She had just received an award from Prince William. She has designed a solar-powered ironing cart which will contribute to improving air quality in India. She is 14 years old. The final words of her address left a lump in my throat, the size of a plum. *"I'm not just a girl from India. I'm a girl from Earth and I'm proud to be so. I'm also a student, innovator, environmentalist, and entrepreneur but most importantly, I'm an optimist."* No security detail for her, no private jet or expensive hotel suite – just herself and her comparatively tiny innovation and invention. She reinforced in me the awareness that I have personally held for a long time: nationality is worthless for we are all citizens of Planet Earth. If we are to survive as a species, we must be ready to cast all selfish or national interest to one side. The plastic we so casually discard becomes a cord that strangles and stifles the life of the Oceans and those parts of the world that are less developed than the West. We must own our own problems, for we have created them. We must be ready to follow the example of the widow sat outside the Temple.

Please note there are no public facilities in the Church.
