

Q52: Lesson 09 How Do I Recognize God's Call on My Life?

Biblical Concept: Calling

Read: Luke 5:1–11

KEY POINTS

- God calls some people to give up their occupations and others to give over their occupations, but all are called to use their lives to rescue captives and draw people to Jesus.
- Jesus enters our boats—our occupations—and overwhelms our expectations.
- God may call you personally or even miraculously. Most often, however, his call comes through others who speak God's truth to us.

THIS WEEK

Day 1 (Eyes): After reading chapter 9 in Quest 52, consider this question: are you able to put into words what God has called you to do with your life?

Day 2 (Ears): First Samuel 3 describes God's call on Samuel's life. What lessons can you draw from this passage about hearing God's call on your life?

Day 3 (Heart): Meditate on the following verses, and ask how they define or describe your call: 2 Corinthians 5:20; 1 Peter 2:9–10; 4:10–11.

Day 4 (Voice): Discussion:

- When you think of a person who is called by God, what or who comes to mind?
- Share about a time when you think God was speaking to you. Do you think God ever calls and we don't hear him or we refuse to respond? What would keep a person from hearing God's voice?
- What are some of the mechanisms God could use to speak to us (such as sermons, books, music, nature, children, etc.)?
- Go around the circle, and tell others what you see in them or how they could draw people to Jesus by leveraging their gifts, resources, and abilities.

Day 5 (Hands): Write a mission statement for your life. How will you use what God has put in your hands to lead people to Jesus?
