Volunteers

We have a strong and vast group of volunteers in our program who have dedicated over 5,900 hours to our community in 2016. Volunteers are all around the campus helping residents and staff. We also have local organizations and corporate groups who join us for days of service, special projects, and events, giving over 650 hours of their time last year.

Individual Volunteers

The Treasure Shop has the largest group of volunteers keeping it alive and well. In 2016, **48%** of NMCGRF's volunteer hours were from the shop's dedicated and reliable group. The volunteers in Independent Living help residents one-on-one in their apartments, often troubleshooting pesky technology issues. Our small, but very devoted group of volunteers who help our staff can be found in offices organizing files and stuffing envelopes. The Sylvestery has an exceptional group of volunteers who have chosen to dedicate their time to residents with memory impairment by escorting residents to daily activities and helping staff prepare different crafts and games. Arleigh Burke Pavilion volunteers visit residents in their rooms, engage residents in activities, and sometimes join the residents on trips.

We again participated in The George Washington University Freshman Day of Service. The students

made military care packages for deployed troops, washed windows at The Sylvestery, and put on a car wash. Other local schools and corporate groups helped with a wide variety of activities and tasks throughout the year including: Chesterbrook Elementarty School, Accenture, Girl Scout Troops, George Washington Universities ROTC program, McLean Presbyterian Church, Navy Mutual Aid Association, Five Star Home Health, McLean Chapter of the DAR, and PRS, Inc. totaling over 700 hours.
