

Target Market Determination – Funds Management

This Target Market Determination (TMD) is required under section 994B of the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth) (**the Act**). It sets out the class of consumers for whom the product (and the particular investment options available under the product), including the key attributes of the product would likely be consistent with their likely objectives, financial situation and needs. Any reference to product in this TMD includes a reference to the particular investment options or choices offered under it and the TMD has been prepared on that basis. In addition, the TMD outlines the triggers to review the target market and certain other information. It forms part of Melbourne Securities Corporation Limited (ACN 160 326 545, AFSL 428289) (**MSC**) and Cache Investment Management Pty Ltd's design and distribution arrangements for the product.

Target Market Summary for the Spriggy Invest Product (The Product)

The Spriggy Invest Product is made up of particular investment options (or choices).

Each of the Investment Options are addressed in this TMD.

The Investment Options

1. **Broad market:**

This investment option is likely to be appropriate for a consumer seeking exposure to:

- a. The S&P/ASX 200 Index before fees and expenses;
- b. The S&P 500 Index before fees and expenses; and
- c. listed emerging market companies.

This investment option can be used to gain exposure to:

- d. Australian listed companies through investing in Aussie Top Stocks;
- e. United States listed companies; and
- f. Listed emerging markets.

This investment option is designed to be used within a portfolio where the consumer has a 7 year plus investment timeframe, high risk/return profile and may need infrequent access to capital.

2. **Equity Strategies:**

This investment option is likely to be appropriate for a consumer seeking capital growth linked to:

- a. Companies that are considered socially and environmentally responsible;
- b. The global health care industry; and
- c. The global technology sector.

This investment option can be used to gain exposure to:

- d. Global companies that are considered 'sustainability leaders' within their industry;
- e. Global pharmaceutical, biotechnology and medical device companies; and
- f. Global technology companies.

This investment option is designed to be used within a portfolio where the consumer has a 7 year plus investment timeframe, high risk/return profile and may need infrequent access to capital.

3. Alternatives:

This investment option is likely to be appropriate for a consumer seeking to track the return of the spot gold price in Australian dollars before fees and expenses.

The investment option can be used to gain exposure to gold as an alternative asset class.

The investment option is designed to be used within a portfolio where the consumer has a 7 year plus investment timeframe, high risk/return profile and needs infrequent access to capital.

4. Diversified Portfolio-Conservative:

This investment option is likely to be appropriate for a consumer seeking a conservatively weighted, globally diversified portfolio of Australian and international assets that offer a steady source of income with some growth potential.

The investment option may be used to gain exposure, on a medium-term basis, to a portfolio of Exchange Traded Funds (ETF's), diversified over asset classes and weighted to reflect a specified level of risk and return.

The investment option is designed to be used within a portfolio where the consumer has a 3–5-year investment timeframe, moderate risk/return profile and may require intermittent access to capital.

5. Diversified Portfolio-Balanced:

This investment option is likely to be appropriate for a consumer seeking a balanced globally diversified portfolio of Australian and international assets offering a balance of both income and capital growth potential.

The investment option may be used to gain exposure, on a medium-term basis to a portfolio of Exchange Traded Funds (ETF's), diversified over asset classes and weighted to reflect a specified level of risk and return.

The investment option is designed to be used within a portfolio where the consumer has a 4–6-year investment timeframe, moderate risk/return profile and may require intermittent access to capital.

6. Diversified Portfolio-High Growth

This investment option is likely to be appropriate for a consumer seeking a globally diversified portfolio primarily comprised of Australian and international equities for their capital growth potential.

The investment option can be used to gain exposure, on a long-term basis to a portfolio of Exchange Traded Funds (ETF's), diversified over asset classes and weighted to reflect a specified level of risk and return.

The investment option is designed to be used within a portfolio where the consumer has a 7 year plus investment timeframe, high risk/return profile and will require infrequent access to capital.

Neither the Act nor ASIC defines when a dealing is 'significant' and distributors have discretion to apply its ordinary meaning. The issuer will rely on notifications of significant dealings to monitor and review the product, this TMD, and its distribution strategy, and to meet its own obligation to report significant dealings to ASIC.</p> <p>Dealings outside this TMD may be significant because:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • they represent a material proportion of the overall distribution conduct carried out by the distributor in relation to the product, or • they constitute an individual transaction which has resulted in, or will or is likely to result in, significant detriment to the consumer (or class of consumer). <p>In each case, the distributor should have regard to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the nature and risk profile of the product (which may be indicated by the product's risk rating or withdrawal timeframes),

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the actual or potential harm to a consumer (which may be indicated by the value of the consumer’s investment, their intended product use or their ability to bear loss), and • the nature and extent of the inconsistency of distribution with the TMD (which may be indicated by the number of red or amber ratings attributed to the consumer). <p>Objectively, a distributor may consider a dealing (or group of dealings) outside the TMD to be significant if:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • it constitutes more than half of the distributor’s total retail product distribution conduct in relation to the product over the reporting period, • the consumer’s intended product use is <i>Solution / Standalone</i>, or • the consumer’s intended product use is <i>Core component</i> and the consumer’s risk (ability to bear loss) and return profile is <i>Low</i>.
