## **Congregational Proposed Budget Meeting**

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SUNDAY, DECEMBER 6, 2020

The meeting was called to order by Nancy McGuire, Moderator, at 11:45 AM. She opened the meeting with prayer. 17 Members attended at Ogden Baptist Church and 10 members were in attendance via Zoom.

The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the proposed budget for 2021. Nancy called on Phillip Cole, Trustee Chairperson, to present the proposed budget. Copies were distributed to all in attendance. Phil opened the discussion with a brief overview of the proposed budget. Nancy then opened it up for questions.

Question 1: Where were the funds for the new furnace being taken from?

Answer: *The Capital Building Fund*

Question 2: What was line item #8 – Education Debt Relief Gift?

Answer: *Money originally budgeted for Pastor Nicole's retirement fund was covered and paid back to OBC by MMBB due to a program that Nicole enrolled in. The monies originally earmarked for this was part of the pastor's budget and was paid to her to apply toward student debt.*

Question 3: What is happening with the cemetery?

Answer: *OBC still owns the cemetery and no other plans or decisions have been made.*

Question 4: What will happen with the rising NYS Thruway toll rates and ES Pass and the new pastor.

Answer: *The budget is currently frozen, and the pastor's budget will be reviewed at such time as a new pastor is called.*

**With no further discussion, Nancy McGuire called for a motion to accept the proposed budget.** The motion was made by David Haines and seconded by Carolyn VanderTang. Motion carried. Budget was accepted by unanimous vote at 11:55 PM.

With no further questions, Nancy asked for a motion to adjourn the annual budget meeting.

**A motion to adjourn** was made by Bonnie McCreight and seconded by Gary Link. Motion carried.

The meeting was closed with prayer by Pastor Nicole at 11:59 AM.

## **Pastor's Report**

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What a year it has been! The COVID-19 pandemic has influenced much of what I have done in 2020. I hardly remember the first few months prior to the shutdown, so I will start in late February/March when we were encouraged to close the building for worship and all other activities.

Within a week of the shutdown, I created a Zoom account for the church, taught myself how to set up meetings and run them efficiently. With the increased risk of "Zoom bombing," I researched way to keep our meetings safe and secure. I helped set up the digital infrastructure for Choir chat and Kid's Faith Discovery, and when Sue and Dale took charge from there. I also helped set up the meetings for the Deacons and Trustees, and Tom and Phil were able to take the reins after that.

During the time of the shutdown, I wanted the church to have a bigger online presence, so I also utilized social media platforms to keep people updated and engaged. The website and Facebook page were kept up to date, and I offered virtual office hours as well as "Pop-On-Prayer several time during the week. The latter two were discontinued at the end of spring/beginning of summer when I was able to go visit people in person. I also held some open office hours at the parsonage where people were welcomed to come for a socially distanced visit on the back deck.

During the shutdown I taught myself how to create, edit, upload, and post virtual services. These took a great deal of time and energy. Depending on the complexity and length, on average, the process took about 15 hours. It was a labor of love, and I was glad to do it so that everyone might hear a word of Good News on Sunday mornings.

Holy Week was organized totally online, and services were conducted with our sister churches, Ogden Presbyterian Church, Spencerport UCC, and Greece Baptist Church. Our special Easter service was also online. The service took me about two weeks to put together, and I was incredibly pleased to learn that people shared it with family and friends. It remains the most viewed YouTube service of the last year.

During the summer and early fall months, I lead the "Garden Book Club" reading group. We met for 13 weeks, reading Rev. Anna Woofenden's book: *This is God's Table: Finding Church Outside the Walls*.

In September we resumed in person services. Mary Jo Green and I drafted safety protocols for reopening the church building for Sunday services. We met every other week for a month and decided it was safe enough to meet every Sunday morning at 10:30am until further notice. I have continued to create a YouTube video (an audio recording of our abbreviated worship service) for folks at home each week and posted them to our website and Facebook page.

Around this time, we started holding in-person services again, we started "Gab, Gather, and Prayer," the Zoom prayer group that met before Sunday's service. This gave folks who were not able to attend in person a chance to see one another and share joys and prayer concerns.

In November I announced that I will be transitioning out of my role as Pastor of Ogden Baptist Church after fulfilling my contract, which ends December 31.

At the time, this report is being written, OBC's plan is to have in-person services throughout December, the remainder of Advent and Sunday after Christmas. Christmas Eve service will be pre-recorded and released early in the day on YouTube, our website, and

Facebook. We did not want to risk turning anyone away because of COVID capacity restrictions, which is why we ultimately decided to have Christmas Eve Service virtually.

To sum it all up: I spent A LOT of time on the computer and the phone, but I was also grateful for the chance to see many of you face to face during the warmer months. Each and every hour was worth it to keep this OBC family connected as best as I could.

I am grateful to have spent the last 3 years with this congregation. Many of you have embraced me like family, and you have played an especially important role in my formative years in ministry. Thank you for everything, and for taking a chance on me to be your pastor for the time we were together. I will think of you often, with gratitude in my heart. May God bless you all in the year ahead.

The Mission budget for 2020 was prepared and accepted by the church membership at a special meeting on March 15. The America for Christ offering in March, Blanket Sunday for Church World Services in May, One Great Hour of Sharing offering in June, the World Mission offering in October, and the Retired M&M offering were all promoted. Most offerings far exceeded the goals set. Deacon's offerings were taken every month and used for special needs. Flowers, gifts, or cards were sent to members and friends of the church that needed expressions of concern or encouragement.

The Member Contact List was updated, and each Deacon has contact responsibilities with each of the members on the list.

Ash Wednesday services were held at the church on February 26 at 6:30 pm. Spencerport Congregational Church (White Church) and Ogden Presbyterian Church also participated in this service.

On March 22, our church building was closed due to the pandemic and our services were pre-recorded and posted on the church's website for members of the church to view. Palms were purchased for Palm Sunday and were made available to those who wished to pick them up at the church.

The church building reopened for in-church services in September. Thanks to our pastor, Nicole Iaquinto, for providing all members with options for attending the church service at church and by recording the service and posting it on the church's website for those members who do not feel comfortable with attending in-house church services. It was also decided this year to do a pre-recorded Christmas Eve service and have this posted on the church's website.

The Deacons discussed reviewing of the church membership roll and decided this was not the year to take any inactive member off our membership list this year due to the pandemic.

## **Trustee's Report**

### **January**

- The Wi-Fi network is working, the new code to get on the network is 585 352 1072. There are 2 more router parts in the office to be set up to extend the Wi-Fi to the sanctuary and educational wing.
- The question of whether to turn the Colby Street cemetery over to the town was discussed. Decided to let the topic percolate. No decision has been made yet.
- Yoga room floor: After Linda spoke with Tom Cole, it was agreed that Linda would purchase the flooring for the yoga room. OBC would purchase the vapor barrier and molding. The floor and vapor barrier have been purchased and are in the hallway. It will be installed January 21 and 22. Linda's brother will help with the project and she will be asking others if they can help. Still must get the molding.

### **February**

- The current door on the handicap entrance has been deemed safe and will not be replaced with a new door or have a crash bar added at this time.
- It was decided that Jim West will keep mowing the cemetery for 2020 for \$40/week.
- Trustees paperwork was filed in the office for the church records by Laurie Cole. This included sexual harassment documentation, workmen's comp paperwork, and other certifications and documents.

### **March**

- The door into the new storage room does not close, needs to be cut off. – DONE 4/14/20. This door has been cut down by Tom and Laurie Cole and is now functioning.
- The parsonage dehumidifier does not empty automatically. Dehumidifier is being emptied manually for now.
- The parsonage furnace filters were changed by Nicole. Has extras (4?) down in the basement for future replacements.

### **April**

- Door to fellowship hall was sticking to floor because of a faulty hinge. The door hinge has been replaced and is now functioning. Hydraulic closing unit has also been replaced.
- Memorial fund: Gary Parker and Tom Olney are looking into how the memorial funds can generate better interest. Currently, the funds are earning .05%. Ally bank would be 1.6%. Ally CD's offers 1.85% (11 months, no penalty withdrawal, 10d interest rate lock-in period). Ally CD's offers 2.0% (1-year plan). Leaving funds where they are for now. Church considered a commercial account.
- Nicole and Phillip signed the Nicole's contract for 2020. A copy was provided to Nicole. Phil has the original that is now filed in the office.
- Email sign up was used for people to volunteer to mow the church lawn.
- Worked with other church committees to coordinate responses and decisions because of COVID-19.

## May

- Spring Cleanup on May 16<sup>th</sup> at 8AM.
  - Some of the brush from the pussy willow tree was picked up.
  - Some of the fallen tree on the west property line was removed.
  - The gravel was removed from the grass.
  - The steel beams behind church and in the weeds were cut up and removed.
  - The wood trusses were pushed to the edge of the property.
  - A screen was installed in the vent cover from the ADA bathroom on the back side of the church to prevent critters from getting in.
  - Leaves were raked and cleaned up.

## June

- No Meeting

## July

- The siding near the ADA ramp was coordinated by Gary Link and repaired by Shawn Powell for \$600. This included siding to bottom of windows, downspout over to lightning rod cable and new flashing and caulking under flashing on foundation. It was coming off the building and the structure underneath needed to be evaluated.
- Sue O. asking to use for choir practice. Ok if social distanced and cleaned after.
- Jason from Churchville Fire Equipment came to church and met with Tom Cole to replace a fire extinguisher and take a few others for inspection.
- Parsonage deck was pressure washed by Bruce Thomas. It had mold on railing and floor.
- A tree had fallen in the South East corner of the cemetery. Phil took what was reachable and safe without a lift down, put it by the road and had the town pick it up.
- It was decided that the Adams Basin choir director would not be able to use the fellowship hall space for recording due to the building being closed because of COVID-19.

## August

- Tom Cole replaced overflow in ADA bathroom to try to resolve constant running issues.
- David Haines painted the wood around the stained-glass windows.

## September

- Bruce Thomas made an extension for the sneeze guard on the pulpit for better protection. He also made an angular book rest for the top of the pulpit.
- Tom Cole did service on all church furnaces. Cleaning and inspection.

## October

- Brandon A. will resign at the end of January from working on the newsletter. Laurie Cole has agreed to help in the office temporarily.
- Linda B. and Nancy O. put carpet tack material under the entry carpet to keep it in place. The carpet had been laying on tile which allowed it to slip around a bit.
- The 2021 plow contract with Cedar Creek Lawncare, LLC has been signed, emailed to them, and filed in the office.
- A Marshall arts group will begin using the fellowship hall twice per week. On Mondays for 2 hours and on Saturdays for 2 hours. They will also be storing their equipment in the adult Sunday school room.
- A capacity of 34 for the fellowship hall was determined using the social distancing rule of 6' between people.

- A OBC Covid-19 Rules were finalized hung in the fellowship hall, so guidelines are clear.

### **November**

- The proposed budget was finalized.
- Tom C. replaced the fellowship hall furnace.
- Phil C. setup the new 65" TV.

### **December**

- A budget meeting was held to vote on the proposed 2021 budget. The budget passed unanimously.

Dale also keeps tabs on the youth group developments. We give thanks to God for all that Dale is doing with the children and pray that all are kept in prayer through these very strange times.

**January 2020** In January, the Elementary Sunday School children focused on understanding how to search for specific Scripture citations as well as understanding the connections between the Old Testament and the New Testament by studying parallel excerpts. Many activities involved cracking secret codes by searching for specific scriptures and verses as well as weekly memory quizzes. Our studies also took us on some modern-day explorations of biblical places. Looking specifically at artifacts and interviews with Bible and history scholars. Our focus for this month was real world application looking at today's Shepherds and hearing stories from missionaries who have given up their modern lives (much like John the Baptist) to share Christ's message with those in third world countries.

Our Middle School Sunday School lessons focused more on the meaning of our faith development. Students discussed how our social-emotional health can affect our relationships with others and with God. As well as exploring how our everyday lives were incredibly a-like to the experiences described by those within the Scriptures.

Faith Discovery continued construction on Solomon's Temple and the finished product was over three hundred pieces when completed. Containing statues and giant outdoor altars, a full staircase and a wall surrounding the project was quite the undertaking! Students looked over blueprints and 3D digital models to aid in their work and the conclusion was quite impressive. This diorama finished our unit on the Kings of Israel and led us through 1 & 2 Kings as well as 1 & 2 Chronicles.

On January 23<sup>rd</sup>, the leaders of the Ecumenical Youth Group, WeMo, held a meeting and discussed how best to move forward in the new year. It was determined that leaders would brainstorm ways to best outreach the local community through service projects and regroup in March.

**February 2020** On February 2<sup>nd</sup> I enjoyed participating in our Annual Superbowl Sunday Sub Fundraiser. It is such a joy to watch the kids at OBC work together to serve the Church and have such fun doing so! Our Sunday School lesson focus in February was on the *Miracles of Christ*. We looked at how each Gospel described the miracles as well reading about some modern-day miracles reflecting on the miracles we have experienced in our lives. Attendance was smaller in February, so we went from three classrooms down to two. However, we continued to reflect on the social-emotional impact of our faith as we studied some of the healing miracles of Christ, looking at how they differed from Jesus' other forms of miracles and blessings.

Faith Discovery switched gears in February as we began to look at Ruth and her role Christ's lineage as well as the lessons her story teaches on loyalty, family, duty, and love. On February 26<sup>th</sup> OBC celebrated Ash Wednesday with our ecumenical partners and I enjoyed yet another "Faith Discovery Service in the Balcony." Followed by a brief lesson on repentance and sin vs our intentionality in our actions. Although this lesson was a heavier one there was mature discussion, and I am beyond proud at the growth I have seen in our youth through the years.

**\*\*March 4<sup>th</sup>, 2020 was our last in-person meeting for all programming\*\***

**April 2020** Our very first Faith Discovery Zoom Edition was April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020! It was incredibly successful, and attendance was more full than usual, so the entire process was extremely exciting. We began to study the Major and Minor prophets, discussing how their prophecies would lead Christ to his own understanding of his fate on the cross.

During this time, I also began collaborating with Pastor Nicole and Sue with weekly Zoom staff meetings and sermon planning. My children's messages were recorded weekly and posted with the rest of our recorded services. In addition to this I began work on an interactive online classroom where many of our Sunday School and Faith Discovery activities and resources could be remotely accessed by students and parents. This allowed almost constant communication between me and our kiddos.

Sunday School was cancelled until further notice per our cancellation policies.

**May – August 2020** Faith Discovery continued to meet remotely on a weekly basis. Exploring the books of Esther and Daniel utilizing a free trial of a remote curriculum; SuperBook Academy. The students really responded to this new study material and the resources were fun and easy to use so the decision was made to subscribe to the full version monthly come Fall. This provided a safe alternative to our regular curriculum considering our Covid-19 restrictions. I was also extremely excited to see how well it fit with our DeepBlue Children and Youth Bibles. The curriculum provides fun stories where through the help of their Bible Robot, friends, Chris, and Joy travel through time and explore the Bible. The curriculum includes games, crafts, historical clips, maps, songs, as well as parent cues and of course the weekly videos.

Weekly staff meetings as well as Worship planning continued as per my role on the Worship Planning Committee. I also continued to record and include my weekly Kid's Min Messages for our virtual worship services. Unfortunately, decisions were made to halt all plans in motion for Summer programming and utilize any pre-made plans for next year's efforts. Our last Faith Discovery Zoom of the Summer took place on July 15<sup>th</sup>. The first three weeks of August were dedicated to curriculum planning for September provided our new format for Faith Discovery and Sunday School and those ideas were shared as well plans for re-opening guidelines at the Board of Christian Educations Summer meeting on August 22<sup>nd</sup>. The decision was made to remain completely remote until further evaluation.

**September 2020** In September we embarked on our very first completely remote Children's ministry! Our first study unit was Joseph. Discussing his history in the lineage of Christ as well as his ability to adapt to situations that were out of his control, much like our own circumstances during the Covid-19 pandemic. Our study theme for this month was 'Giving God Control.'

Meanwhile our Faith Discovery kiddos reviewed the Old Testament before they embarked on the second half of their goal to finish reading the entire Bible! Playing review games as well as looking back on some of our favorite Old Testament stories felt like we lost no time at all.

Although our Children and Youth were fully remote, I remain available for counseling and worship assistance, aiding with service as well as working with youth and families through personal outreach.

**October 2020** As disappointing as it was to be unable to celebrate together this Autumn season students in our Zoom Sunday School still had fun learning to face their fears with our study on Joshua and Caleb as they entered the Promised Land. This was an exciting unit to explore as it opened us up to thinking about ourselves as agents of God on a mission to explore the unknown and bring light to the darkest places. Our character study inspired youth as they related to the courageous young men experiencing completely new environments and circumstances. Our study theme for this month was 'Facing our Fears with Faith'.

Faith Discovery kiddos enjoyed finally reaching the New Testament in October! First looking at the history of the sources who were the inspired writers of the Gospels. Comparing their writing styles and intentionality behind their unique perspectives on the story of Jesus Christ.

**November 2020** In November Sunday School students went back to before the Pandemic and re-explored the miracles of Christ from a different lens. Jesus helped so many people in so many ways. By prayer, by teaching, by healing and by providing (service). Students were asked to look at the ways that Christ served and reflect on our gratitude for those great acts as well as ask themselves how they could model those acts in their lives today. An Attitude of Gratitude was our theme for November and our focus was discussing how to re-focus our attitudes and be gracious to God regardless of our current circumstances.

Faith Discovery finally got to read the New Testament in November, beginning with the birth of John the Baptist from Luke's Gospel account. This was an excellent segue into our Advent studies. Students enjoyed looking at the remnants of Zechariah and Elizabeth's home as preserved in Jerusalem as well as checking out pictures of gold coins with the image of King Herod's head!

**December 2020** It appears Advent 2020 came upon us with the blink of an eye. This year is much different than years past, no special solos, no pageant, no giant tree in the Sanctuary adorned with our favorite ornaments. However, our youth and children are not to be put out of the Christmas Spirit. Our study theme was 'The Reason for the Season.' Focusing on how all Christmas needs to be really Christmas is the Christ child. Discussions revolved around how we could find hope, joy, love, and peace in a time where there is a lot of chaos, confusion, anger, and fear. I genuinely enjoyed teaching this Advent season as I felt it was the closest representation of what the Hebrews may have felt like in the time where they too, were waiting for a savior.

Must be a 'God Sighting' as we reached the Christmas story in the Gospel just as Advent approached in Faith Discovery's mission to read through the entire Bible. Students explored the history behind the story so often represented in movies and children's stories. A more vulnerable and mature snapshot of the Holy Family as their story certainly was not all



rainbows and butterflies. But the truth of the season is also the magic of the season. A baby born to a broken world. A savior waited for. Grace unbounding, undeserved, and unexpected. Throughout this year struggles I genuinely believe God always was and will remain with us into the year to come.

## **ABC/RGR Report**

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Ogden Baptist delegates to the American Baptist Churches of the Rochester Genesee Region are Tom Olney and Mary Jo Green. The first delegates meeting of 2020 was held at Aeon Missionary Baptist Church on January 25.

Announcements introduced the new pastor for Webster Baptist Church, The Rev. Dr. David Spiegel, the region's office administrator, Tarra Hartman and a guest from the American Baptist Foundation, Kristine Lutten.

The Rev. Rachel McGuire gave a presentation of an online resource that she is developing, *The Community Learning Channel*. This venture is organized under the not-for-profit, Innovative Models for Community Learning Inc. 2. It is hoped that region churches will use this tool to share church community information. The website can be viewed at [www.communitylearningchannel.org](http://www.communitylearningchannel.org). This is a work in progress.

The business portion of the gathering began with roll call of churches, distribution of mission giving certificates, and acceptance of previous minutes. Finances were reviewed and a replacement to the Executive Board was voted in. Next was a Resolution of the Delegates of ABCRGR. This resolution followed the tabled discussion from September regarding the sale of the former Lyell Avenue Baptist Church property to Cameron Community Ministries, which has occupied the property since the 1980s. Further discussion of the conveyance and transfer of the property to Cameron for \$1 ensued. When all questions were satisfactorily answered the delegates voted to approve the property transfer. The legal ins and outs will be handled by the region lawyer, Executive Minister, and the Executive Board. The meeting then ended.

On the afternoon of May 31st, the second meeting of Region delegates met via Zoom due to COVID-19. Being the Sunday following the death of George Floyd in Minneapolis, the opening discussion sought to address concerns for racism in our country, policing practices and thoughts on what churches can do in the face of these systemic issues. Discussion sought answers to the question, "What can we do to become the people the church needs today?"

Following this discussion, the meeting came to order with the roll call of churches at around 25 to 30 churches attending, with about 60 persons on the Zoom call. Previous minutes were accepted, followed by Region President's report, and Executive Minister's report. Scott McClellan, region treasurer, reviewed the financial situation, noted the switch to a new accounting firm, and that the Endowment Fund is being tapped. Sandy reported that a PPP (Payroll Protection Program) loan was applied for and received, 75% of which will be used for payroll. The next item of business was a review of changes in the by-laws which tighten up language used and will bring things in line with state requirements. These changes were accepted with a unanimous vote. The last item was the vote for and welcoming of a new congregation to our region. This congregation is the NY Kachin Baptist Church here in Rochester. Several members of this church shared about themselves and then we voted to accept them into the region and closed with prayer. For those who wanted further discussion of the racism issues the meeting was kept open. The work of love continues.

The ABCRGR Biennial Gathering was a virtual event in the last week of September and first week of October with the Delegate's Meeting, via Zoom, on September 27, 2020. "Turn on the Lights" was this year's theme. Webinars were offered over the two-week period for

those who wished. Several areas of interest were covered including racial justice, environmental concerns and matters of faith.

The Delegate's gathering was via Zoom and got underway following some sign-in glitches. An opening prayer was followed by a celebration of ordination anniversaries. (Of note, Nancy Leport celebrated 30 years since her ordination.) Next on the agenda was a celebration of the property transfer to Cameron Community Ministries. Director, Jennifer Muniga, was on hand and shared history and current activities. (Check out their updated website at <https://cameronministries.org/>. From International Ministries, Joyce Bagiraneza, shared greetings, and thanks for support of their 206 years of global mission. She shared mission focus areas of inviting (make disciples), proclaiming, and equipping. ABC churches are in partnership with International Ministries through the World Mission Offering. A recorded message from ABCUSA interim General Secretary, Jeff Woods, was shared and he spoke to the challenges and opportunities of change.

The business meeting was called to order and the roll call of churches showed 24 churches to have registered. Previous minutes were approved, and recognition and thanks were extended to those going off the Executive Board. The new slate of officers and board members was reviewed and voted in with one abstention. Sarah Culp of Greece Baptist Church is the new region president, and our own Fred Dean is the vice president. (Full slate available on request.) Following a brief service of installation of board members and officers we moved next to the financial report and 2021 budget proposal.

Treasurer, Scott McClellan, reviewed the current state of region finances. Scott observed that it has been a challenging year though things were on track with respect to directed giving. Extra expenses this year included a consulting expense, purchase of new office equipment, and the cost of installing Zoom was more than expected. Salaries are where they should be, there was no travel expense and as of September finances were showing a positive \$14,000.

The 2021 budget proposal was reviewed and discussed. Total income is expected to be down next year. This writer has trouble following all the ins and outs of various funds so cannot go into any detail. Salaries were discussed, Tarra Hartman, region office administrator will receive a raise, a new bookkeeper is needed; that salary will stay the same and Executive Minister, Sandy Hasenauer will receive a 2% cost of living increase. Bottom line - it is expected that the region will be short by approximately \$25,229. A marketing campaign is to be developed to close the gap.

An unrestricted endowment fund is board controlled and it was felt it would be unwise to tap into it for budget gaps. Generating a stream of income would be preferred. With discussion, an amendment to access up to \$25,000 from the endowment fund for emergency use was accepted with 3 against. The budget was passed with the new amendment.

We then heard from Beth Short, our outgoing president, as well as Sarah Culp, our incoming president. Goals include creating a caring community, extending care to one another. Executive Minister, Sandy Hasenauer, closed the meeting sharing how she enjoys working with the region churches. We have had to make a lot of adaptations this year. With appreciation for our time Sandy closed the meeting.
