around the traps

I am fairly sure if you had a wish list for rain every year, 70 or 80mls in the beginning of October would be right up there for most graziers on the tablelands. Especially after a September that was possibly a little drier than expected given the season. I am not so sure that the wish list would include a few sharp frosty starts, though they don't appear to have done too much harm. On top of that, the wind we experienced last Friday and Saturday was pretty tough to deal with, although nothing like the storm Armidale received on Thursday night.

Armidale was underneath a really bad event some years ago when hail stones as big as tennis balls and bigger did so much damage. This time it was a twister, and it was wind that did the damage across a narrow strip on the northern side of the town. I was talking to one person who lives just north of the Uni and he said they were unaware the storm had done any damage until the next morning. Being in the eye of the storm was terrifying, with houses ripped apart, trees thrown around and even a car turned over. Remember the storm at Niangala some years ago? It was very severe with nothing spared in the path of that storm. Walcha township was so lucky to have avoided the storm's path in December '18, which could have been so much worse. It has reached the point that when there is a big storm brewing, I find myself hoping that we are not in the path of it regardless of the rain benefit. There are a lot of us who found themselves in the path of the December '18 storm who still have plenty of damage remaining to be cleaned up. I don't think many realise just how long it does take to get things back to where they were before these events and rarely is anyone carrying insurance that will help rectify the damage. It is not a quick fix.

We are half way through October and there are still few signs livestock numbers are about to spike as they may normally do at this time of year. I see that sheep numbers have now reached an estimated 70 million head, which is evidence the flock is building again, around 10% this last twelve months. The flock was at its lowest point for a century during the recent drought when in 2020 numbers got as low as 64 million head. Sheep numbers are forecast to grow to 76 million head by 2023 which by then we will be hoping all the processors are back in full swing. The rapid growth in numbers has been put down to the wonderful seasons we have experienced for the last 18 months or so, resulting in flock retention and a reduction in mutton slaughter numbers. The live export trade has also been affected by the rebuild with 2 million sheep moving east from WA after we emerged from the drought. However, there are signs there is life in the live export trade and markets are starting to open up again. MLA forecasts are for lamb slaughter numbers to reach 20.55million head this year which is much faster growth than originally predicted. Average carcass weights are also going up as markets are requiring more weight and higher levels of efficiency.

I think Australian Whites are in danger of reaching the status of Ostriches a few years back. Remember those heady days when a breeding pair of Ostriches could make \$50,000 plus and there was no end to how big the market potential was of those birds! I think the Aussie Whites are wonderful sheep, (I have some) but demand for ewes and rams has far outweighed supply, to the point it is difficult to see how anyone is doing their sums on returns. I can see how the purchasers can justify \$165,000 for a stud ram at a time when the numbers are building and there is strong demand for the breed. But I can't see how commercial producers can justify paying an average of \$14,000 for commercial grade rams. Sure, they are breeding replacement ewes, and they are valuable, but only if you are selling them. At the end of the day, it is all about slaughter value and you don't get paid any more for these sheep on the rails than any other. So, I have a lot of trouble justifying the value being paid for these sheep when at some point the market will be saturated and they will be back to the field like everything else. Happy to be wrong on this one!

Congratulations to the new Premier of NSW, Domonic Perrottet, not only for being elected as the new Premier, or even for announcing that his wife was expecting their seventh child, but for his announcement on opening up the State's borders to international travel. It is so important we get back to some sort of reality and we get international travel going again. There are so many businesses reliant on tourism and it is totally unrealistic to think we can stay locked up like WA and QLD seem to think they can. We also need to get a lot of Australian citizens who have been trying to return to Australia, home. They have been locked out of their country for nearly two years, and in my view it is a disgrace that we have treated them this way. It bothers me that QLD and WA think they are such good managers of the pandemic because their constituents have been able to live largely COVID free. What they neglect to acknowledge is that they have done nothing to help other states or Australians as they have played their part in bringing in those returning home and the like. If it were up to WA and QLD, we would all be locked away for ever!

Fill in survey on Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill

A Bill that will allow voluntary assisted dying in NSW has been introduced into the NSW Parliament by the Independent Member for Sydney Alex Greenwich.

Member for Tamworth Kevin Anderson said that this deeply personal issue was a very delicate subject that would create discussion at many levels in the community. NSW Nationals members of Parliament will be granted a free vote on the floor of the Parliament when the bill is eventually voted on.



"As a result I am canvassing the community on their view as to which way they would like me to vote on their behalf.

"Community consultation is underway and already I have received more than 800 responses. The consultation involves various formats including mail outs, online survey, phone and direct contact with my office and I expect more submissions to come flooding in once debate in parliament begins.

"The question is "do you or do you not support voluntary assisted dying in NSW"

"I want to thank everyone who has registered their interest so far and I encourage anyone who has a view to share that with me. So far from the 849 responses, 462 have voted no and 387 have voted yes.

"The opportunity to register your view will continue also include a letterbox survey which will be delivered in coming days that will run in parallel with the debate in Parliament as its happening.

"I will be taking the community's majority decision forward in Parliament so please make sure you let me know your thoughts."




Add vaccination proof to Services NSW app

Proving COVID-19 vaccination status when checking into public venues across NSW has just gotten easier with the COVID-19 digital vaccination certificate ready to add to the Service NSW app.

How to add the COVID-19 digital vaccination certificate to add to the Service NSW app:

1. Ensure your Federal MyGov account is linked to Medicare
2. Download the Express Plus Medicare app and sign in with your MyGov account details
3. Select 'Proof of vaccinations' and then 'View history'
4. Select 'Share with check in app' and then 'Service NSW'



Digital and Customer Service Minister Victor Dominello said the integration of the vaccine certificate with the app will make things easier for the people of NSW.

"This is an extra digital service to make life easier for the businesses and customers of NSW as we open back up. NSW is the first jurisdiction in Australia to roll out an integrated QR code solution for displaying vaccination status state-wide," Mr Dominello said.

"When someone visits a venue, they'll be able to show their green check-in tick and vaccination status simultaneously, saving staff and customers time."

The Service NSW app will include a number of security measures to help compliance officers and businesses with checking and validating a customer's vaccination status, including a NSW Waratah logo hologram and rotating QR codes, similar to the Digital Driver Licence.

From Walcha Community Care

Walcha Council Community Care is a community-based service for the senior residents of Walcha. Featuring a variety of programs, including Meals on Wheels, Individual and Group Social Support and Community Transport, WCCC is designed to support the senior residents of Walcha to stay independent for longer, while providing great social opportunities to encourage them to remain engaged in their town.

WCCC is looking for a new member for the team. We are offering a full time, two-year traineeship for the right person, of any age to join our service and help us in providing support to our elder community. The role provides a lot of variety and an opportunity to develop skills in the Community Services sector, working with clients who do not have high physical needs but require access to social opportunities. If this is you, please go to the Council website (Council, Positions Vacant) for more details as to how you can apply.

The services and activities that WCCC deliver include monthly morning teas, regular excursions around the New England area, phone call check ins, community café, bbq's, lunches out, trivia, scenic drives and cards to name a few. Some local groups, including the Walcha Quilting Group and Bingo also utilise the rooms which are set up for people to access comfortably and easily. There are also special events including guest speakers, Melbourne Cup luncheons and Christmas parties.

The Meals on Wheels service supplies a hot lunch, as well as frozen meals to a number of our locals who find cooking to be challenging for a variety of reasons. This service is supported by an amazing group of volunteers who offer their services every month to deliver the meals to the clients.

WCCC also works with local services to provide the clients with meaningful assistance during the COVID-19 isolation periods. The staff at the Walcha branch of the Commonwealth Bank worked to create over 70 individual care packages for the people over 65 that live alone in our community. These were then distributed by WCCC, along with regular phone calls and mail outs to ensure that everyone was coping during the lockdown.


