A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT & CEO

Dear Friends of Truman,

It is with great excitement that I share Truman Center for National Policy's 2021 annual report, the organization's first such report since 2012.

Simply put, 2021 was a year of dramatic growth and impact for Truman Center. Despite the continued challenges posed by the pandemic and widening global instability, this was a year of palpable acceleration. Truman Center delivered a steady stream of high-impact programming, dynamic reports, and training that offered timely, principled, and innovative solutions to pressing national security challenges.

Here are just some of the highlights:

Our report on "Transforming the State Department" took the D.C. establishment by storm. We shed light on the structural inequities that exist within diplomacy and foreign policy, and offered a pathway for the institution's reform. Chaired by Representative Joaquin Castro, Ambassador Abercrombie-Winstanley, and Senator Chris Murphy, Truman's expert task force offered recommendations on how to make the State Department a more just, equitable, and innovative institution so that it can extend its diplomatic reach and better deliver for the American people. The report continues to receive significant media coverage and I am proud to say that it became a foundation for Secretary of State Antony Blinken's Modernizing Diplomacy agenda.

Our April report, <u>"Special Immigrant Visas: A Call for Cooperative Action</u>," issued succinct policy recommendations to the Biden Administration to ensure the safe evacuation of our Afghan partners, and kicked off our media <u>campaign</u> that reached millions of people around the world.

When Kabul fell to the Taliban in August, the groundwork laid by our SIV report helped Truman launch its <u>Afghanistan Operations Center</u>. By recruiting and coordinating more than 100 volunteers, who provided 24/7 coverage, our team helped to manifest and fill seven private charter flights, and ultimately evacuate over 1,000 people.

We expanded our bench of expertise, bringing on new Senior Visiting Fellows to cover key policy issues, such as climate & energy, city & state diplomacy, and immigration. Under the extraordinary leadership and partnership of Truman Center Board Chair, Stephen Bailey, our <u>Board of</u>

<u>Directors</u> grew as we welcomed talented new members: Damon Wilson, Rebecca Bill Chavez, and Jeremy Bash. We also relaunched Truman's <u>Board of Advisors</u> to expand our access to expertise.

To better communicate Truman's reach and impact, we undertook a full scale brand overhaul by relaunching the Truman Center <u>website</u>, renovating our social media channels, and creating a modernized visual identity. As a result, we now have a look and feel that matches the saliency and dynamism of our work. And our media-outreach has also grown dramatically. From the pages of <u>Vogue</u> to the <u>BBC</u>, we have reached 600 million people across the world this year alone.

We were proud to host a safe in-person annual conference, #TruCon2021, last year, while observing a range of stringent health and safety protocols. We began with a special welcome by Secretary of State Antony Blinken, followed by a keynote address by Deputy Secretary of State Wendy Sherman. What followed were a series of insightful panels, including: A Reflection on Afghanistan & the Future of U.S. Power; Restructuring the Department of Homeland Security for a Better Immigration Solution; Transforming the State Department and the Role of Cities & States; and Climate & National Security: Green Tech as Foreign Policy.

As we welcomed a limited number of in-person attendees to <u>TruCon2021's</u> public day, we also drew reporters from Axios, Bloomberg, PBS, Politico and The Diplomatic Courier. Our large virtual audience of over 1,500 attendees included viewers from as far as Brazil, Canada, Israel, and Malaysia.

I hope you enjoy reviewing just how much impact Truman generated this last year. We have worked to deliver an inclusive U.S. foreign policy that makes American lives better because it advances democracy, human rights, prosperity, and security at home and abroad.



"Truman has been at the forefront of the immediate Afghan response, supporting our work within the Evacuate Our Allies and #afghanevac coalitions to identify and implement solutions at every stage of immigration and the ensuing crisis," said Mackler. "The role of Senior Immigration Fellow at Truman has provided the opportunity to continue my research in immigration policy and national security, and expand our network for impact within the membership."

Camille Mackler is the Executive Director of the Immigrant Advocates Response Collaborative (Immigrant ARC), which she helped form and has led since February, 2017. Prior to transforming Immigrant ARC into an independent non-profit, she was the Director of Immigration Legal Policy at the New York Immigration Coalition, successfully pushing for increases in public funding of immigration legal services in both New York City and New York State. She recently helped draft legislation that created the first right to universal representation of immigrants in the country.

"Nuclear nonproliferation, or preventing the spread of nuclear weapons, is a critical element of reducing the existential risks nuclear weapons pose to humanity," said Egel. "My fellowship at Truman provided an incredible opportunity to conduct meaningful work engaging legislatures and raising awareness on nuclear issues, and to develop my own research on reducing nuclear risks. Working with the Truman Center team was a delight—TCNP is truly a model in how a small group of dedicated people can create enormous changes."

Naomi Egel is a Ph.D. candidate in the Government Department at Cornell University. Her dissertation examines why states pursue multilateral agreements to regulate various weapons, and how the motivations for doing so affect the design of agreements. More broadly, her research explores the politics of international security, international organizations, small states, and international order.

Nuclear Nonproliferation

Truman is working hard to make nuclear issues accessible to all. We produced a short video on *Nuclear Weapons: A Guide From Truman* in May to build awareness of global nuclear risks and to engage the public on the importance of reducing nuclear threats. The video provides a clear and easy-to-understand guide on the context surrounding today's most pressing nuclear issues.

State Department Reform

On March 3, 2021, Truman Center <u>publicly launched</u> a <u>State</u> <u>Department Task Force</u> and the first-of-its-kind "<u>Transforming</u> <u>State: Pathways to a More Equitable, Just, and Innovative Institution</u>" report. We provided bold recommendations for how the State Department must transform into a more equitable institution in order to develop foreign policies that better reflect connections between international and domestic concerns.







Climate



Other public engagements included Jenna taking part in a press conference with the "Evacuate our Allies" coalition, calling for urgent action by the Biden administration to support the resettlement of Afghan refugees. She also signed onto two letters, one to support our at-risk Afghan allies with over 100 other organizations and another to call on President Biden for humanitarian relief in Iran.








Truman Center Honors Mayor Bowser with Public Service Award

The Truman Center for National Policy will be hanoring Mayor Muriel Bowse Award in Public Service at this year's TruCon conference.

WASHINGTON D.C. - The Truman Center for National Policy is proud to honor Mayor Muriel Bowser with its 2021 Exceptional Moral Courage Award for her unwavering leadership and commitment to public service. The ceremony will take place on Friday, October 15th at 2:30pm ET, at #TruCon2021, Truman Center's annual national security conference

This award began in 2020, amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, Lt. Col Alexander Vindman (Ret.) was the inaugural recipient due to his courageous public testimony that resulted in former President Trump's impeachment proceedings. This year, Lt. Col Vindman will be stepping back onto the Truman stage to present the honors to Mayor Bowser

"Mayor Bowser has set an incredibly high standard for governance - especially in major US cities," said Jenna Ben-Yehuda, President & CEO of the Truman Center for National Policy. Given the immense challenges Mayor Bowser has faced — from the COVID-19 pandemic, to the January 6th insurrection, to a contested election, to standing up for racial justice with the creation of Black Lives Matter Plaza — she perfectly encapsulates moral courage in public service."

Mayor Bowser was re-elected to the District of Columbia Mayor's office in 2018, making her the first mayor to win re-election in 16 years, and the first woman ever to do so. Since her election, Bowser has faced unscrupulous adversity. All of which she faced with grace and leadership, as she continues to fight to build safer, stronger, and healthier neighborhoods across Washington D.C.

"Since the earliest days of the pandemic, I have said that we are in this together and that we'll get through it together. I am incredibly grateful for the tremendous sacrifices that DC residents and businesses have made over the past two years. 

THE CREATION OF TCAOC

On August 19, 2021, Truman Center launched the Truman Center Afghanistan Operations Center (TCAOC), which directly evacuated 1,000 vulnerable Afghans and liaised with a range of national security agencies and NGOs to facilitate shared database entries of thousands of additional applicants. Through continued support from donors, we expanded the work following the US military's departure from Afghanistan to support continued evacuation.

What How

Identified, tracked, and advocated on behalf of more than 13,000 at-risk Afghans. After receiving thousands of requests for assistance, including from the U.S. Government, TCAOC created a volunteer-supported database to match evacuees with available seats on planes, and partnered with Google to build a program that tracked the status of Afghans' evacuation, immigration, and resettlement needs.

Placed more than 1,000 Afghans on at least seven flights departing Kabul.

Through 24-hour volunteer coverage, the team monitored available seats on planes, relying on on-the-ground reports, and the TCAOC database to place at-risk Afghans on those flights.

Equipped members with contact information, comprehensive resources, and reliable intelligence.

Launched and, at the peak of the evacuations, provided hourly updates to a knowledge management platform that centralized policy materials, near-time situation reports, trainings, and Member support services.

Secured free mental health services for members and supported 45 Truman and 13 non-Truman frontline workers with meals, childcare, and other personal services.

Launched a program connecting Members with frontline workers who helped meet practical needs, and supported their mental, emotional, and physical well-being.

To help our community members and stakeholders communicate the impact of our withdrawal from Afghanistan, Truman crafted <u>Special Immigrant Visa Talking Points</u>, published in April 2021, and a follow-up <u>SIV two-page brief</u>, published in <u>August 2021</u>.






