Outdoor and Adventure was our P.E focus over the past two months. We started off by exploring all along the very picturesque riverbank. In orienteering, we learned how to orientate maps correctly and things got a little competitive when we did an orienteering course around our school grounds. Catching was our fundamental movement skill for January and February. We had great fun practicing the skill through games like BOMB!, Piggy in the Middle, Catch it if You Can, The Secret Robber and Dodgeball! Every day, we get out and get active around our school walkway.

In art, we busied ourselves creating clay models. We created beautiful gnomes, turtle pinch-pots and daffodils to celebrate the arrival of Spring. Fifth Class


We have earned our mid-term break in 5th class after all our hard work in the last few weeks!! In Literacy, we began the term with Readers' Theatre and we're enjoying working on our fluency and expression using our scripts. Narrative writing is the genre we are focusing on at the moment and we have worked hard at developing different characters. We have begun setting descriptions and are examining all the different types of adjectives that can be used to develop our writing. In Irish, we are also reading Léithoireacht Amharclainne (Readers' Theatre) and we are using An Garbhán (The Gruffalo) as our script. We are looking forward to performing this for Seachtain na Gaeilge.

Friendship Day on Valentine's Day was a highlight for us. We had a fabulous day celebrating each other and our friendships. We wore our own red and pink clothes on the day and brought in red and pink fruit and vegetables in our lunch boxes. We started the day by getting a "secret friend" who we had to make a special effort to be kind to. At the end of the day, we guessed who our "secret friend" for the day was. The artistic challenge for the day was to design a class heart that reflected the theme of friendship and we are thrilled with how ours turned out. We took inspiration from the beautifully illustrated book, "The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse" and used buttons, crepe paper and cotton balls to complete the heart.

Clay was the medium we chose for Art for the last few weeks and we made clay hearts, clay handprint bowls and clay monsters. We learned many skills including rolling clay, modelling clay and scoring clay. The monsters, in particular, turned out spectacularly well....if we do say so ourselves! We also looked at Zentagle patterns and made Zentangle hairstyles on our own faces!

In SESE, Energy and Forces has been the strand we have been studying and particularly electricity and circuits. We learned about the different parts of a circuit and we constructed simple circuits using motors, lightbulbs and buzzers. Using this knowledge, we made real working lighthouses and rainbow spinners. We were very lucky also that the STEM Department of Mary Immaculate College sent us Scribblebot kits to make using ciruits, so we had great fun designing, testing, making and decorating these.

Finally, Safer Internet Day was another successful day for us as it allowed us to have important conversations around our use of digital devices. We had an Internet Safety seminar via Zoom with Zeeko and we made an online class code!



Sixth Class

It's hard to believe we have reached our mid-term break. Rang a Sé have had a busy two months and are well ready for their briseadh leath téarma. This term, we started preparing for our Confirmation. We have been learning about the gifts of the Holy Spirit and how they bear fruit in people's lives. To help us prepare for our big day, we headed off to De La Salle Pastoral Centre in Co. Laois for a fantastic retreat on February the 7th. The theme of our retreat was "Shine Your Best Self" and we enjoyed a lovely day of reflection, prayer and meditation. It has been a while since we have journeyed on a bus trip together, so we thoroughly enjoyed the day, including the stop off for food and a chat on the way home.

As well as working on ourselves spiritually, we have been keeping fit by working on the strand of Dance in P.E. So far, we have perfected the "Walls of Limerick" and "Staicín Eorna" and we hope to dance these at our Céilí Mór in Seachtain na Gaeilge. Our FMS for this term has been side – stepping and we have been playing many games to practice this skill, including "Side Stepping Musical Chairs", "Side Step Across the Sea" and "Go Get the Beanbag". Thanks to the Active Schools Committee, yard leagues are up and running again and we are enjoying skipping and playing "Bomb" daily.

World War One has been our strand of study in History and in Literacy we have been engaging with a Readers' Theatre script entitled "The Christmas Truce". This tells the story of the famous Christmas ceasefire in World War One and we have enjoyed developing our fluency and expression while performing this. We are also focusing on Narrative Writing in Literacy. Currently we are examining how to describe a setting effectively and how the use of metaphor, simile, personification, onomatopoeia and visual and auditory imagery help to do this.

Sa Ghaeilge, we have also learned that there are similes in Irish too. We each created our own comic full of Irish similes on the app "Comic Life" on our I-pads. We have also been learning about the weather – an aimsir and finished the term with group performances of the weather forecast in Irish. Bhí siad thar barr!!

We have been experimenting with the medium of clay in Art this term and have created some truly unique sun tiles and fish pinch pot bowls. We have also been designing "Women in Construction" posters for the school competition being organised by the builders of our new classroom. In February, we learned that Clodagh in our class had won the National Prize in her age category in the Credit Union Art Competition. Clodagh is a highly gifted artist and one to watch out for in the future. Comhghairdeas Clodagh. Táimid an-bhródúil asat.

Our design and make projects in Science have centred around magnetism and electricity. We had a hugely competitive grand prix in the classroom with the magnetic cars we designed and created. More recently, we also put what we have learned about electrical circuits to use, by designing electric quizzes together.

A big thank you to our Health Promoting Committee for organising our Friendship Day, which was great fun. The egg carton boxes we have collecting for the past month were put to good use on the hearts designed by 6th class and the day gave us all a chance to reflect on what makes a good friend.

Safety and Protection have been to the fore in SPHE, with every class engaging in the "Stay Safe" lessons this term. To tie in with this, we celebrated Safer Internet Day on February 8th. Our webinar with "Zeeko" highlighted the area of Cyberbullying and helped to increase our awareness about our digital footprint and the importance of using the internet responsibly.
