Army veteran lost his job while fighting cancer. Financial strain made the holidays hard for his young family. We raised funds, bought and wrapped gifts for his family and we have stayed connected with this family.

Consulted with Rugby Washington to develop a strategic plan, developed sales & marketing collateral and advised on how to grow the program.

In spring 2023, SRC raised funds to support a youth rugby director in the Pacific NW, fostering player and coach development on and off the field and paving the way for sustained development opportunities in the PNW.
