
2. About EnegeX

EnegeX is a mineral exploration company, based in Melbourne and listed on the Australian Stock Exchange (ASX: ENX).

3. Project Background

EnegeX has built a strategic tenure position in the West Yilgarn Ni-Cu-PGE province, the prospectivity of which has been highlighted by Chalice Mining's Julimar Ni-Cu-PGE discovery. EnegeX's West Yilgarn Province tenure comprises 20 granted exploration licences totalling 3,784km².

EnegeX has grouped its tenure into five project areas named Miamoon, Miling, Walebing, Goomalling and Green Hills. These project areas have been identified to host mafic and ultramafic rock sequences that may have the potential to host Ni-Cu-PGE mineralisation.



4. Exploration Licences

Before accessing, exploring, or drilling on any land, an explorer must apply for and have a granted mineral exploration licence over the area of interest.

The Mining Act, administered by the Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety (DMIRS), governs the licence conditions and relevant processes. In the case of privately owned land, an access agreement with the landowner is required prior to a company conducting any exploration activities in the licence area.

Work permits must also be obtained from DMIRS prior to conducting certain exploration activities within an exploration licence. These permits contain detailed conditions to minimise disturbance and environmental impacts.

If your property falls within the area of an exploration licence, it does not automatically follow that access to your land will be requested. EnegeX will contact only those landowners whose land falls within targeted exploration areas, with the majority of areas within these exploration licences not affected.

Please note that an exploration licence does not allow the holder to conduct any mining activities. A mining licence must be granted for this to occur, a process which can take many years to approve.

5. Exploration Activities

EnegeX is currently exploring for a variety of minerals (including nickel, copper and platinum group elements). All planned activities will take place within granted exploration licences.

Planned activities include non-ground disturbing exploration (eg soil sampling, airborne and ground-based geophysics, and satellite imagery) and exploration drilling (auger and reverse circulation rigs).

6. Environment

EnegeX takes its environmental responsibilities seriously and understands the sensitivities of working within the Wheatbelt region.

7. Stakeholder Engagement

Engagement with external stakeholders has commenced. The company is currently contacting landowners to arrange access so that the company can begin exploring on private land.

We aim to communicate with stakeholders in person where possible. Every effort will be made to meet with the stakeholder at their property or an appropriate location proximal to the area of proposed work.

There may be occasions where no appropriate company personnel are onsite. In these cases, EnegeX welcomes any inquires via email or phone.



We will respect the rights of all landowners and seek to minimise any potential disturbance associated with our activities as much as possible through the following commitments:

- Provide key information on our exploration activities to local stakeholders.
- Consideration of any social, environmental and economic effects of EnegeX's activities at the local stakeholder level.
- Seek to understand stakeholder values, interests and concerns and address these in a timely manner.
- Ensure our employees and contractors are aware of their obligations with respect to the local community and environment.
- Contribute to the community through providing local employment opportunities and utilise local contractors and suppliers where possible.
- Communicate effectively through various means, including:
 - One-on-one meetings
 - Telephone conversations
 - Letter drops
 - Email communications
 - Local and regional media placements
 - Posting on our Company website

This statement is complementary to the regulatory requirements and established procedures governed by the Western Australian Mining Act 1978 (the Mining Act).

All community feedback will be carefully considered when deciding how to proceed with exploration programs and all reasonable measures will be made to ensure a satisfactory solution is achieved for all parties.
