VISION



BEST strives to help create a world in which no one is trafficked. BEST believes that every person has the right to be free from commercial sexual exploitation and forced labor.

MISSION

BEST educates employers to prevent human trafficking and creates pathways to employment for survivors.



OUR PROGRAMS

Employer ACTS is the overarching program that includes all of the different services BEST provides for employers. ACTS represents:

- **AWARENESS:** BEST raises awareness about how employers can help stop human trafficking.
- **CONSULTATION:** BEST consults on best practices and provides model policies for employers.
- **TRAINING:** BEST trains employees to implement best practices and stop exploitation before it happens.
- **SAFE JOBS:** BEST enables employers to provide jobs for survivors of trafficking and people considered at-risk.

THE SCOPE OF THE PROBLEM:



Human trafficking is (1) the use of force, fraud, or coercion to compel a person into work or prostitution or (2) engaging a minor in a commercial sex act.

13,594 calls from victims and survivors of trafficking were made to the National Human Trafficking Hotline in 2020.

500-700 youth are exploited in the sex trades in greater Seattle.

Black and Indigenous girls and **LGTBQ2IA+ youth** are disproporationately targeted by human traffickers.

Foreign nationals account for **57% of victims** in active forced labor cases in the US.





OUR IMPACT

Over the past decade BEST has impacted millions with awareness and training on human trafficking:

- **122 million** media impressions to raise awareness about human trafficking
- 116,642 people trained to identify and assist victims
- **500+ survivors** and at-risk individuals achieved employment



SOCIAL CHANGE

Our training sparks social change:

- 97% of training respondents said BEST's training will help staff to prevent sex trafficking
- After training, respondents' understanding that most prostituted people are forced, coerced, or abused into prostitution increased from 53% to 84%
