Offering Our Prayers

Gathered at the Eucharist we bring our prayers to God. We each have our own needs. Friends are sick. Neighbors are losing their home. Kids need work. The goldfish died. We bring these prayers to church because they remind us of our need and they raise our hopes in the power of God.

We have those hopes because God has rescued us time and again. Our relationship with God has produced fruitfulness, satisfied our longings, and brought us peace. Because of God's faithfulness, we give thanks, offer sacrifice, and once again present our needs.

Melchizedek is a mysterious figure from the Book of Genesis who prays as we do. King of Jerusalem, priest of God Most High, he blesses Abram, whose armies have just won a victory. Melchizedek brought out bread and wine, and Abram offered him a tenth of his possessions.

The entire scene foreshadows our celebration of the Eucharist. God has rescued us from death. Jesus reigns as our king and priest. The community offers bread and wine. We each offer a tenth of what we own in sacrifice to God. When we worship at mass, we imitate the pattern of our ancestors' worship. Every generation has the same needs. We present them to the same God, who works the same wonders in our midst.

Faith Formation continued...REFLECTION

Today is a very special day in our Church liturgical year. If you were listening before Mass when the announcements are read, you may have heard that today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Eucharist, Holy Communion, is the source of our faith! It is why we do what we do as Catholic Christians.

Fr. Larry led the faith formation children, teens and families in an instructional Mass last Fall. Preparing for the consecration, Fr. told us that Jesus took the bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it. Took blessed, broke, gave. At every Mass the gestures of Jesus at the Last Supper and in today's Gospel in the story of the loaves and fishes, describe those actions. These are holy actions.

As we observe this special day, let us all give special attention to how we receive the Eucharist: We are to approach the Eucharist with hands folded prayerfully, eyes towards the Body of Christ (host) and then receive with our hands ready and open as we extend our hands towards the priest or Extraordinary Minister. We are to say, "Amen!", out loud because "amen" means, "Yes, I believe". Then we place Jesus in our mouths as soon as we receive Him returning to our seats reverently because we now carry Jesus within us. We kneel to pray to Jesus, welcoming is now PHYSICALLY He SPIRITUALLY present in our body and soul.

We do not sit again until the tabernacle (gold box which holds Jesus (the remaining consecrated hosts from Holy Communion) is closed.

How blessed are we to receive Jesus! Thank you for your Gift to us, Jesus!
