Paddling Down the River

Join the group for a leisurely paddleboard excursion! In fact, there is no better way to experience the beautiful prairie scenery and all that Saskatoon and the area has to offer than from the majestic Saskatchewan River.

We will transport you from the Bessborough to your put-in location of either Poplar Bluffs or Fred Heal Canoe Launch to start your journey. You will be outfitted with all the important gear like a board, life jacket, whistle, and leash. From there, the guides will lead you through the winding river. You will stop for a lunch on shore complete with individual charcuterie platters and other yummy goodies.

The remainder of your paddle will lead you back into Saskatoon on the South Saskatchewan River to the public boat launch, just south of the Bessborough Hotel. It's a short 5-minute walk back to the hotel from there, as you gain your land legs back!

We anticipate paddling time will be approximately 4.0 – 4.5 hours, depending on weather and skill level.

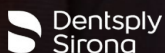

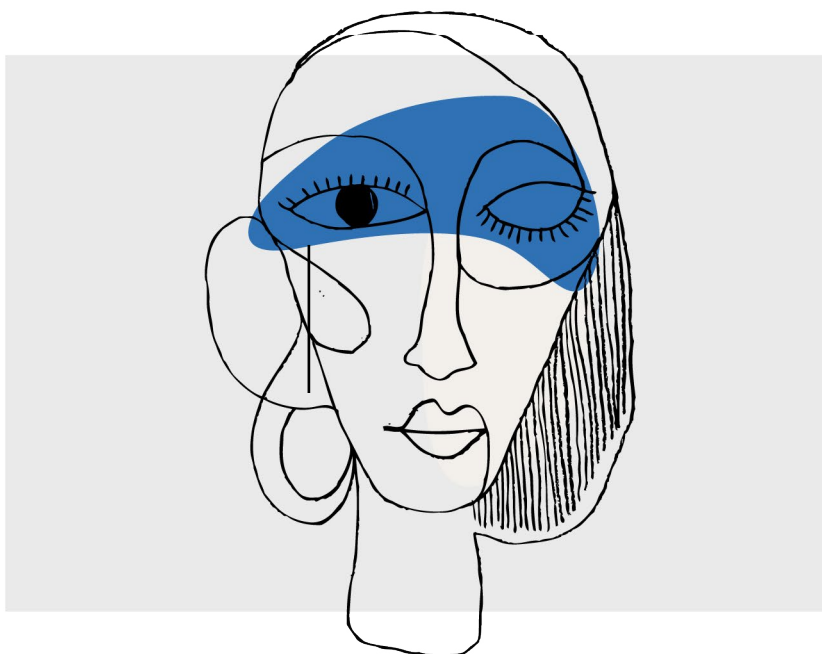

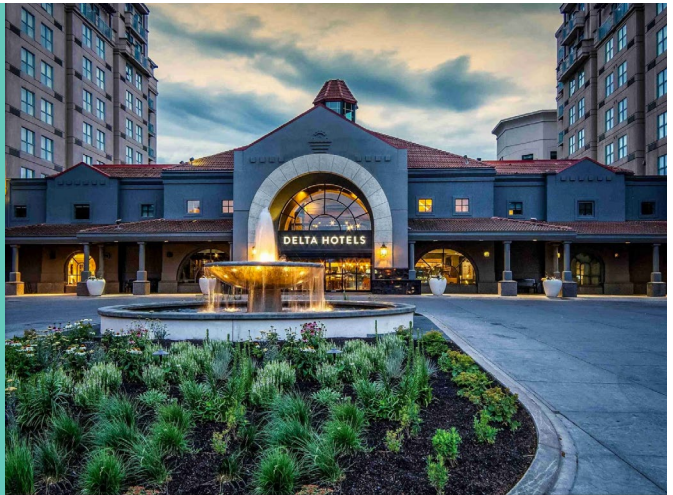
