This week, Year 5 and 6 attended two workshops looking at keeping safe in the community and how to become good citizens. He informed us how to stay safe when using social media apps or carrying out online gaming; emphasising that we need to really consider the information we reveal about ourselves on these platforms. The pupils all participated well and enjoyed the friendly quiz questions which they answered well.

Next week Y6 will be the first children to visit our hut and choose a book. 
