- Builds a strong framework for patients, families and caregivers; and
- Implements an improved digital health strategy to transform the way care is delivered

"The Central OHT for Specialized Populations is changing the way health service providers, professionals, and persons with lived experience work together to improve the quality of life of clients/patients, care partners, and families in this region," said Debbie Islam, Vice-Chair of the Central OHT for Specialized Populations Steering Committee and Chief Executive Officer at Alzheimer Society of Simcoe County.
