While the COVID era has more we'd wish to forget than remember, one significant development was our pivot to hybrid meetings. Projectors, GoPro cameras, Zoom and more. Who would have thought just a few years ago a global pandemic would have brought us together for general meetings in digital form. Since September's general meeting, the club has invested in more technology to amplify the online experience of our meetings. A dual wireless microphone for audience use, a wired microphone for the front table and a microphone mixer to connect them all to the multimedia ThinkPad that runs the Zoom meetings. As a state-wide organisation, everyone with internet access can now attend meetings.

This is particularly important & not just for the obvious reason of following the events & management of your club, but as Steve Treloar has graciously highlighted, even the President doesn't need to be Sydney-based. Also, the Pennykids connect to the meetings through Zoom, having moved to the Central West. As I type this, the Vice President position remains vacant and the Club requires it to be filled. And just when you thought meetings were boring, we gave away hundreds of dollars in vouchers at the last AGM! Thanks must go to Trevor Dean for his ongoing hard work as BMWCA Delegate. Similarly, thanks go to Paul Ioakamidis and Bob Madell for representing the interests of the BMWTCNSW at the Motorcycle Council of NSW.

This year we brought back the short presentations that take place immediately after the general meeting closes, so members can share their recent adventures. Or newsletter advertisers can tell us about their business, so we can support them as they support us. Or we may even be able to invite guest speakers, too. I would like to see more hands go up to make a presentation, but all in good time. Thank you to the newsletter team, headed by Alan Pennykid, for putting together our marque publication each month.

By the numbers, our Facebook strategy is a success. The public page is steadily increasing in all metrics, and the member's only page is skyrocketing. In barely 12 months, over one-third of club members have joined the page (keeping in mind not everyone has a Facebook

presence). 94% of members are active and posts are up 32% in the last 90 days alone. It is evident that potential members may search and find our public page only to realise there is so much more.

Earlier this year we sought to invest in the tool library by updating it and suggestions are always welcome. Thanks to Rob Edgar for managing the tool library. Also, thanks must go to our Assets & Archives guru, Mal Cattermole. All volunteers are valued at BMWTCNSW.

The new website is probably my biggest project with the Club to date. The need to update the website was prioritised in late 2021, soon after the new members-only Facebook page was created. Without stepping through the whole process, we first mapped how the website and Facebook pages would work together, given their uses in the marketplace, strengths and weaknesses. After over six months of strategizing, planning, mapping and development, the new page went live the evening of 6th October. This project will continue for at least another year, since going live with the new page was just the first of many milestones. Over the next six months we hope to go-live on individual members logins, where more features & benefits can be provided and experienced by our financial members. For the end of this financial year, we will be investigating being able to take payments for membership renewals within your online login. Thanks must be extended to John Visser, for whom this project wouldn't have moved forward without his early direction and technical know-how. Thanks to Courtney Dorward for volunteering the services of his business for our benefit, but also deciding to join us as a member along the way. I guess he liked what he saw in us.

2023 promises to be bigger and better than ever! And not just because rallies and rides are being planned, but more events than ever before are being put together. The type of events that only clubs with decades of experience can seek out for their members, to appeal to all motorcycle interests. Late February will see Warwick Schuberg, founder of Australia's largest motorcycle training company, invite us to see his private motorcycle collection of over 100 motorcycles. April Fools Day is when we head to the unique experience that is Neville Siding for our annual movie night (and pizza).

As always, it is *your* club. However you wish to engage with your club, it survives because so many members are engaged with the club. Support the events, volunteer if you like, attend meetings to see how your club is being run and provide feedback. 2023 will be our 58th year of more fun, memories and BMW bikes!

Various inputs were received from the many experienced tourers with the BMW dual gloves getting rave reviews far and wide but they're not cheap at all so they were put onto my wish list.

But as luck would have it at the Far Cairn rally I was able to score a voucher with Bikebiz to the tune of \$250 oz pesos from the raffle there.

Yeah baby, I could now afford to do some more thorough investigation. I ventured to the big smoke on a Saturday and straight away got lost in the multitude of buildings that make up Bikebiz, I could happily spend all day there.

I was meet by a lovely sales assistant who took me through all the pros and not so few cons of these gloves. Essentially what they are two pairs of riding gloves in one. Kangaroo leather palms with Gore-Tex inserts.



One side you slip your hand in and it's probably equivalent to a late summer to late spring style of glove and the other side a winter glove. Ingenious design that provides comfort and great hand protection.

I used them on my way to Phillip Island for the MotoGP this year from a cold Goulburn to Cann River and even though I had never used the gloves before they fitted like a well-worn glove the first time, usually it takes me well over a week to wear in new gloves.

So even though I'll probably only use them on really cold rides I do plan on a few of the winter rallies in coming years and I can see no reason why these will not last me many riding seasons.

## 16 Days In Northern Vietnam part 1.

In October this year I spent 22 days in northern Vietnam and 15 and a half were on the seat of a Honda CRF250L. I flew in from Manila after spending 16 days visiting my brother in Puerto Princesa on the island of Palawan, Philippines and due to the inconsistent flights schedule I had arrived in Hanoi 4 days before our tour began and my son Chris and good friend Dave Pickford were due to arrive 2 days after me so we had a few days to wonder around Hanoi taking in the sights and to do Hanoi Backstreet tour unfortunately Dave had not noticed that his flight arrival had changed from his original booking and his visa did not start until the 8<sup>th</sup> of October and he was now due to arrive at 23:30 on the 7<sup>th</sup> and because of this he was not allowed to board his flight in Sydney. They would not even let him wait in the airport for 30 minutes until the midnight had brought in the new day and to make a long expensive story short he arrived the next day via Singapore and a different air line. This had killed our Backstreet tour plan but we did take it when we returned to Hanoi after our tour. Hanoi Backstreet tour I would highly recommend if you're ever in Hanoi, it's a 4.5 hour tour with a meal for \$50USD riding around on the back of a Russian Minx motorcycle. They do have jeep and walking tours as well but jeeps won't fit into some of the places the bikes can get into.

Our tour began on Monday the 10<sup>th</sup> leaving from the Old French Quarter of Hanoi straight into peak hour traffic, I had ridden in this before but it for my son and friend it was there first time at riding on the WRONG side of the road but they adapted quickly but the harder part is in Vietnam if you leave even a millimeter of space anywhere some WILL jam a scooter in there to try to get passed you, there's nothing aggressive in it, it's just their way and they just give way to each other. We weren't on the traffic for too long before our guide took us down onto a side road paralleling the main road for a while then we turned a headed bush and down to the Red River following it through fields and tracks before popping back out on the main road outside the town Son Tay for our first rest stop. From



here things got a dirty, we'd turned onto what would best be described as service roads running alongside canals and storage ponds and at one stage the road just stopped. I think mainly for not being used but our guide pushed through the scrub creating a path that eventually met up with another path on the other side but this scrub was full of long thorny bushes and he discovered that the fingerless gloves he wore were not really up to this to of task. Eventually we got to Son Tay, we'd taken about 7 km to do the 3 km to the town and we stopped there for lunch. Lunch comprised of deep fried frog (it does taste like chicken) smoked goose, Buffalo, pork and veggies at a local restaurant



and while we were there the local constabulary pulled in with two Police motorcycles and a small tip truck with five confiscated scooters on the back. This became a common sight during our trip and even seeing them set up very much like a radar sting you'd see in

Australia but they were after something far more deadly than speeding scooters they'd be set up with binoculars looking at on coming scooters and if you were heinous crime of not having mirrors they would swoop down on you with an instant fine or steal your scooter as our guide would say. Leaving Son Tay we continued the side track roads finding more and more, long muddy bog holes but finally getting back onto main roads and started to move up into the hillier regions at this end of the country is known for. When riding the north of Vietnam most of the time you're either going up hills or down hills but ALWAYS going around corners there are not many straight roads, Fun, Fun, Fun. After winding up through the mountains for most of the afternoon we stopped at a coffee shop/lookout and down below was our first stop for the night in a homestay in the Lac Village in the town of Mai Chau and as the sun was starting set the three horsemen rode into town. Usually on these tours they will include three or four Homestays on a tour and we'd asked for a few more because you get meet the locals a lot of the times and that can be very interesting.

**Day 2** dawned and after we'd had breakfast and packed up we went for a short ride around the village before heading for our next destination. The village even though spread out had narrow roads between building, barely wide enough for a car so you're always looking in case you need to take evasive action and passing through on our left were a group of women doing a Vietnamese Stick dance (look it up) but our guide just rode straight by so I stopped to take some photos.



We back tracked back to the main road but was not on it for long before going bush, up into the hills along dirt roads that had the occasional small waterway running across it until we came to a fork in the road and Xuan our guide whips out his phone trying to remember the route as he'd not been in the area for some five years and after and doing a quick recon of the other track we were off and not far from here the fun begun L with steep climbs that then turned into steep rutted climbs both Chris and I fell and of course there's the steep rutted down hills and over the next few hours for me



the falling was a recurring event, then when we got down onto the flat the track disappeared into a river that was flowing so fast we pushed the bikes across and at the end I sat in a side stream to cool myself down. After the river crossing we went up through corn fields and more bad ups and downs until eventually we came across this local on a scooter who was ferrying bags of grain up and down this slippery hill and across this homemade bridge that I didn't think would hold me and the bike,

the bikes were walked across, by this time I was totally drained and was struggling to ride in a straight line on the dirt and Dave who had been fairly gung ho had reefed his shoulder and was now a bit more subdued, but we made to the next village and in need of a feed, water and rest. Xuan got the local "store" to kill a duck and cooked it by boiling and we feasted on Rubber Duck and rice, if we had not eaten that duck it would have died of old age the next day. As with a lot of these villages the locals came to meet us and we were the first foreigners some of them had ever met and

even though the language barrier is there they were so friendly and courteous. They are amazing people.

After an hour or so we were charged up and ready to ride, Dave's arm was a bit of a worry but he soldiered on (scans back in Sydney found he has a partial tear of the rotator cuff and a tendon) the dirt road slowly became tar then dirt then tar and all of a sudden there was this beautiful waterfall on the left and with lots of photos taken we were back on our way. The road was amazing with band after bend winding eventually down to the Da river where we waited for a ferry, it was around 5pm we were low on fuel and our next stop was the town of Phu Yen, two and a half hours away and



night was not far away with the sun setting around 5:30pm and 91km to go with half of that in the dark. After the first fuel station were closed we eventually refueled and finally arrived around 7pm.

## SOME ODDBALL BIKES

I recently took a trip up to Cairns to check out the Australian Armour and Artillery Museum (AAAM) established by Rob Lowden back in 2015 or so. Rob is a local businessman (seafood and property development), who likes to collect tanks (the military kind). You need lots of space even for one Tank but Rob had several, so, he decided to get serious and built a bloody great big shed for his collectibles plus a workshop to restore them along with some space to give them a run. The result is what you can see today and it's quite an impressive show to say the least. So, what's this got to do with motorcycles?

Well, hidden among the tracked behemoths are two gems

in the form of a Zundapp KS750 outfit and an NSU "Kettenrad" Light Half Track Gun Tractor – both machines seeing combat in WW2. According to the AAAM, 18,695 Zundapps were produced and they had drive to both the rear wheel and the sidecar wheel (would be great for the OCR)! The AAAM's exhibit is in very good condition and probably worth quite a bit.

The "Kettenrad" is a very bizarre creature in the form of a twin-tracked motorcycle.



Some 8,340 were produced during WW2 for all sorts of odd jobs including carrying supplies to the front line, transporting troops (two anyway), runway tugs for aircraft and for laying communications cables. At 1,560 kg it certainly wasn't a featherweight but its 36bhp could propel it to 70kph. Such was its appeal that another 550 were produced after the War. You could steer it via the handlebars and via each track brake. It had 3 forward and one reverse with high and low range selections. Again, an excellent conveyance for an OCR if you could get hold of one.

If you are in Cairns, the AAAM is well worth a browse. It's professionally presented with each display item having its own comprehensive description. Not a single cent of public money has gone into the museum and Rob Lowden has to have spent many millions on it for a world class result.

**Private Motorcycle Collection -  
Warwick Schuberg & the Amaroo Bike Museum**

Warwick Schuberg founded Stay Upright in 1982, after a desire to expand the skills he taught to NSW police officers as their senior rider instructor at the NSW Police Force Motorcycle Training School to the general riding populous. This facility hosted displays and demonstrations to regular riders on public holidays, but more was needed.

This was the beginning of Stay Upright, named for the catchphrase police would say to one another as they rode out at the start of each shift.

The journey of Stay Upright over the past 40-years is also the story of Warwick's opportunity to build his own motorcycle collection. It is quite fitting that his collection is housed at Amaroo Park, since that's where he first expanded Stay Upright's initial rider training courses.

The collection is easier seen than described, since it needs to be experienced. Separate to public motorcycle museums, Warwick's Amaroo Bike Museum is filled with whatever took his fancy at the time. Whether it be something to restore / rebuild and appreciate, or just appreciate.

Warwick will be on-hand to discuss his collection. Photos are encouraged.
