Will you play a role in the future fight for fairness?


IHC began in 1949, when Margaret and Hal Anyon took action to give their son Keith the life he deserved.

Because Keith was born with Down syndrome, he was denied the chance to learn or be part of society.

After seven years of fighting for Keith's right to an education, Margaret and Hal still had no response from the government. So they formed the Intellectually Handicapped Children's Parent's Association.

That was the start of IHC, the pioneering charity that still works tirelessly so New Zealanders with intellectual disabilities can live with meaning, choice and opportunity.

How to leave a gift in your Will

Deciding on who will benefit from your Will is one of the most important and personal decisions you will make.

But the steps are very simple.

1. Speak to your loved ones

We encourage you to talk to your loved ones about your decision to leave a gift to IHC so they understand the importance of this gift to you and the difference you can make in so many lives.

It's important to remember you can provide for the people you love – and still leave a life-changing gift to IHC.

2. Visit your solicitor

Most Wills are prepared by a solicitor or trustee company, who will advise you on what you need to consider when making your Will.

You'll need to tell them who you want to benefit from your Will and who will act as your executors.

Here is some wording your lawyer may wish to use:

"I give the gift of _____ (your lawyer will complete this) to IHC New Zealand Incorporated (registered charity number CC22478), for its general purposes, and I declare that a receipt given by the Chief Executive or other authorised officer shall be an absolute discharge to my Trustees."
