


DISCOVA DAY TOURS



Bali is known for its handmade Batik fabrics, and Tohpati is a great place to see them being created.

Jewelry lovers will enjoy a stop in Celuk, where a variety of styles are available to admire and purchase.

The Tegalalang rice fields are a popular spot for photographers seeking iconic Bali images.

A delicious lunch can be had at a restaurant in Ubud, which also offers a chance to see the mischievous macaque monkeys in the Monkey Forest.

The day's itinerary includes a visit to Tegenungan Waterfall, a scenic and relaxing spot in a lush jungle setting.



The tour starts in Tohpati, where Bali's famous Batik fabrics are handmade.

Then, visit the village of Mas, known for its skilled silversmiths who create a range of jewelry styles.

The Tegalalang rice fields offer stunning scenery not to be missed.

Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant with beautiful surroundings.

Don't leave Ubud without seeing the playful macaque monkeys and shopping at the Ubud Market for clothing, jewelry, art, and souvenirs, where bargaining is expected.



Start the day early with a trip to
Sahadewa village for the Barong Dance.
This performance showcases the battle
between good and evil and the
invulnerability of the Barong followers.

Visit art centers in Ubud, Mas, Celuk, and Batubulan for crafts and stone carvings.

Stop at Tirta Empul and have lunch in Kintamani with views of the magnificent Mount Batur and Lake Batur.

End the tour with a visit to the Monkey Forest in Ubud.



Visit the famous Pura Luhur Uluwatu temple, perched above the water, offering a stunning view of the beach and Indian Ocean waves.

Keep an eye out for monkeys and enjoy a unique Kecak dance performance featuring 100 men swaying and chanting to the hypnotic music.

The dance portrays the ancient story from Ramayana of King Rahwana capturing Sita, Rama's wife, and the battle between Rahwana and Hanoman, leader of apes.
