What: Asking '5 whys' allows us to get to the

1. Answer the 5 Why's

Ask a core question to your product or service then continue to ask "Why" four more times.

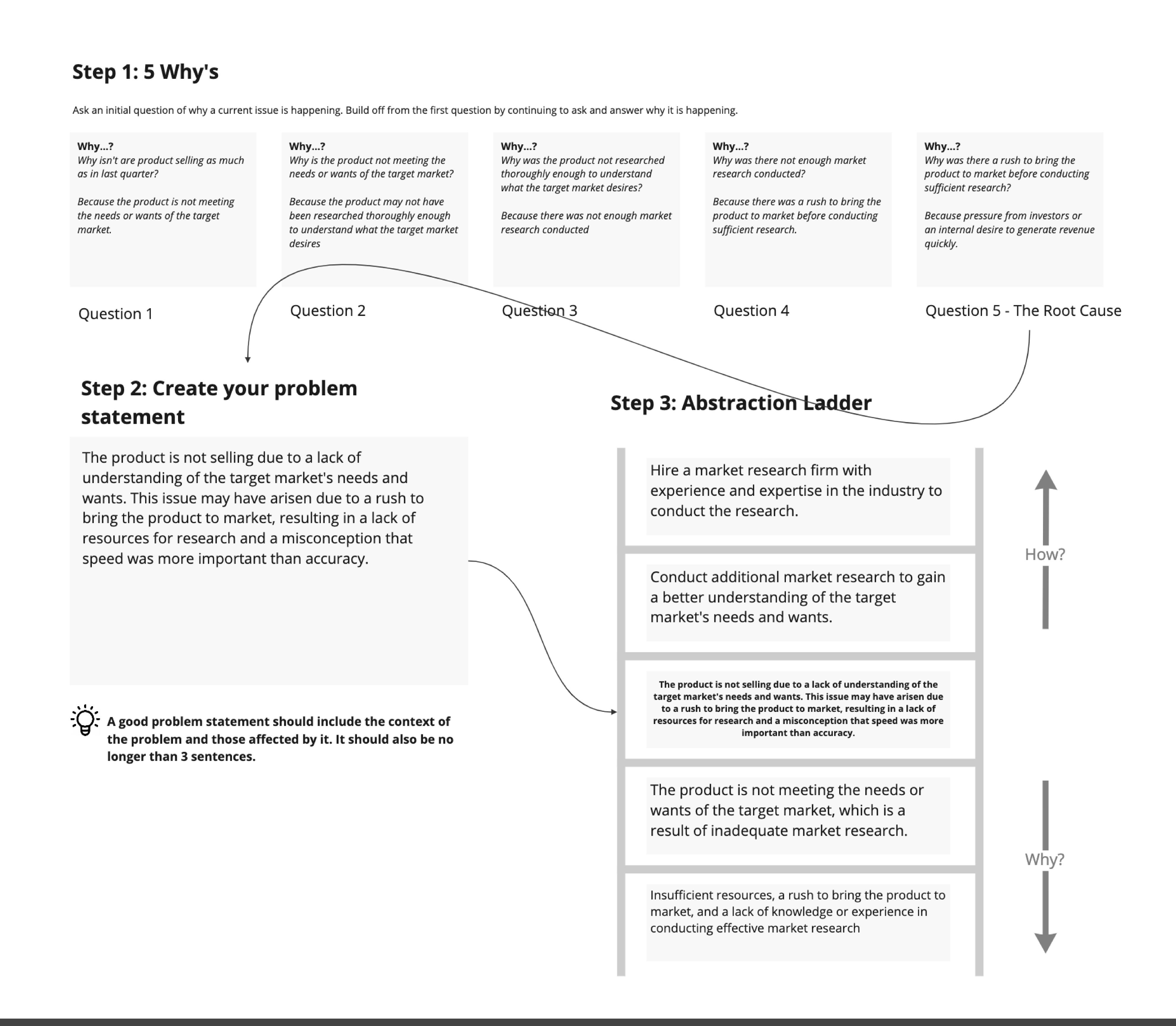
2. Create a Problem Statement

Create a problem statement using the root of the 5 Why's i.e., what's the REAL problem

3. Abstraction Ladder using your Problem Statement

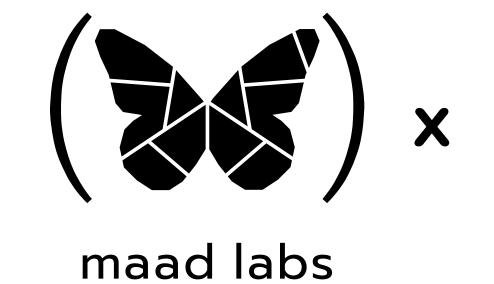
Using abstraction laddering, move up and down in abstraction using your problem statement. Move up the ladder by asking "How?", and move down by asking "Why?".

Abstraction Ladder: Worksheet

Step 1:

Ask an initial question of why a current issue is happening. Build off from the first question by continuing to ask and answer why it is happening.
