Why have a Big **Education Conversation?**



Conversations about the purpose of education are important in transforming education systems. They help different groups, like students, parents, educators, and government leaders, to come together and share their beliefs and hopes. Through Big Education Conversations anyone can contribute to creating a shared purpose and vision for education.

Who can start a Big **Education Conversation?**

Whether you are an individual or an organisation interested in transforming education, you can use this guide to facilitate a group discussion. Gather 3-12 people for your conversation, or more if you make sure there's enough space and time for everyone to be heard.

A Big Education Conversation in Five Steps

STEP 1: Choose a facilitator and ideally someone to take notes.

The facilitator's job is to keep the conversation curious, inclusive, and fun!



Everyone shares their name and answers a simple question, for example: what colour comes to mind when you think of school? Describe your favourite teacher in one word?

Briefly discuss why you are having this conversation. As a group what do you hope will come from the discussion?

STEP 2: WHAT IS



First, reflect on your own beliefs about the purpose of education. Go to <u>bigeducationconversation.org</u> and answer the **5 question survey.**

Then, share and discuss the results as a group. Take time to be curious about the views of others.

STEP 3: WHAT IF

Education **can** be transformed. Many systems were **designed** in a different time for a different purpose. Is it time for a system update?

Be playful, creative and reimagine education

If you could reimagine or redesign education, what **big changes** would you make and why?

Offline? Then discuss these questions instead:

What do you believe is the purpose of education? Do others share this belief?

What does your education system currently prioritise and are you happy with this?

STEP 4:

Choose next steps and make a commitment. What is a small step you/your group could commit to making that would positively change education for/in your community?

Record and share your commitment with others using #BigEdConversation #millionconversations.

If you're the facilitator, don't forget to add your conversation to the global map and feedback your insights.

Write and take a photo of your commitment, or record it!

STEP 5: TAKE AWAY

What are you taking away from your conversation?
