SAMARITAN PROGRAM

This summer, you will begin to see a new image associated with the Samaritan Program – a shock of wheat.



For almost 70 years, contributions to the Samaritan Program have helped residents of the communities of Pinnacle Living when they are most vulnerable. The Samarian Program provides financial assistance to those who, through no fault of their own, become unable to meet the full cost of our services. In Fiscal Year 2022, a total of \$338,137 was provided through the Samaritan Program, bringing to total amount provided in benevolent care support in the last ten years to \$7,029,024. 83 percent of the recipients in FY 2022 were women. 50 percent resided in health care households and neighborhoods. 
