FOREWORD

Cricket is Australia's favourite sport, and in NSW we have a strong, passionate, inclusive and multicultural cricket community. Spanning from regional NSW to our cities, there are over 160,000 registered players and 450,000 participants, ensuring cricket is in the fabric of almost every community in NSW. At Cricket NSW our purpose is simple - to inspire everyone to play and love cricket.

Cricket NSW is uniquely positioned in providing significant return on facility investment with an ROI of 18:1. We are unashamed advocates for investment in our communities, often providing our own funding to do so. Since 2013, Cricket NSW, in partnership with Cricket Australia, has provided approximately \$7.86 million in funding to support 335 NSW cricket projects. As part of our Cricket NSW Community Impact Study 2020, we estimate that cricket in NSW attributes a total economic benefit of \$385,716,706 to the New South Wales economy annually.

Additionally, cricket in regional NSW is often the glue that binds communities together. This is reflected by the fact that 55% of current contracted NSW Blues and Breakers players are from regional NSW and historically approximately half of our participants have come from our regions.

Partnerships with all levels of government have been critical in being able to provide the necessary opportunities for communities to play the game, particularly for women and girls, as well as diverse communities. However, with a fast-growing population and increasing participation as we recover from the COVID-19 pandemic, it is crucial that cricket can continue to grow to develop our future female and male stars.

The purpose of this document is to provide the blueprint for the next term of government to support the continued growth in the game, unlocking investment in local communities and delivering positive health outcomes across the state. Cricket NSW looks forward to partnering with government and other stakeholders on these key priorities for the benefit of the community.

NORTH SYDNEY OVAL

THE HOME OF WOMEN'S CRICKET

North Sydney Oval has hosted some of cricket's most important and memorable women's matches, including the 2009 Women's Cricket World Cup Final and the inaugural Women's Ashes Day/Night Test in 2017, where Ellyse Perry scored an incredible double-century.

Sydney's northern suburbs are one of the fastest growing regions in the country when it comes to girls' participation in cricket. With this in mind, North Sydney Council and Cricket NSW have developed a joint proposal to protect the oval's heritage and character, while cementing its future - with a modest investment to ensure the ground is a fitting venue to stage elite women's sport in the 21st century.

Not only is North Sydney Oval the home of women's cricket, but it has also previously hosted the inaugural Sydney Swans AFLW match and Women's Rugby League games. This proposed investment would not only support the growth of women's sport at the venue, but would also allow the North Sydney Bears a viable home venue for their respective NRL and NRLW licence bids.



The proposal will improve player and fan comfort, increase accessibility for the diverse fan base our sports attract, and ensure North Sydney Oval continues to be a great place to watch sport for families from across New South Wales.

North Sydney Oval currently lacks a permanent structure for players along the ground's boundary. Permanent dugouts on the boundary, accessible only by participants, would be safer than portable structures erected in public thoroughfares. These structures require temporary infrastructure and security overlays to ensure safety. As mentioned, accessibility for our diverse fan base is also of high importance. The proposal will also improve accessibility at North Sydney Oval, with increased disability access, and ensures public restrooms are fit for purpose for families, women, and girls through the provision of mother's rooms, change facilities and modern bathrooms for all spectators.

North Sydney Council estimates these improvements will cost more than \$11 million.

- Increased and improved food and beverage concession facilities
- Accessibility improvements for spectators
- Public toilet amenities refurbishment of all the existing facilities
- Replacement of existing timber bench spectator seating with individual seats
- Releveling playing surface
- Substantial upgrade of existing community and stakeholder facilities
- Improvements to media/broadcasting facilities
- Improved player and game officials' facilities

NEWCASTLE NO.1

Newcastle's main cricket ground - No.1 Sportsground - is classed as a Tier 4 facility and requires a number of further upgrades to ensure it is a facility fit to host first-class cricket. Whilst Council has undertaken Stage 1 upgrades to the venue, it still does not meet minimum standards to host elite level cricket.

Newcastle and the Hunter has a vibrant and growing cricket community, with over 22,000 registered players. This attributes to a total economic benefit of \$11,307,873 to the New South Wales economy annually.

As New South Wales's second largest city, Newcastle deserves access to participate and watch first-class cricket - which hasn't happened since 2015. The Hunter region has a long tradition of developing elite cricketers to NSW and Australian squads. These include; Paul Wilson, Leah Poulton, Belinda Clark AO, Bob Holland OAM and Jason Sangha, just to name a few.

PROPOSED UPGRADES

- Better player and match official infrastructure, a turf training facility, and contemporary upgrades to changeroom facilities.
- Better fan-facing infrastructure, including the provision of new entry points and shaded seating, plus updated restrooms that improve accessibility for girls and women, and people with a disability.
- Media infrastructure to ensure the ground meets broadcast and livestreaming requirements, this includes the upgrade of floodlighting to broadcast standard of 1500 LUX.

HUNTER PARK



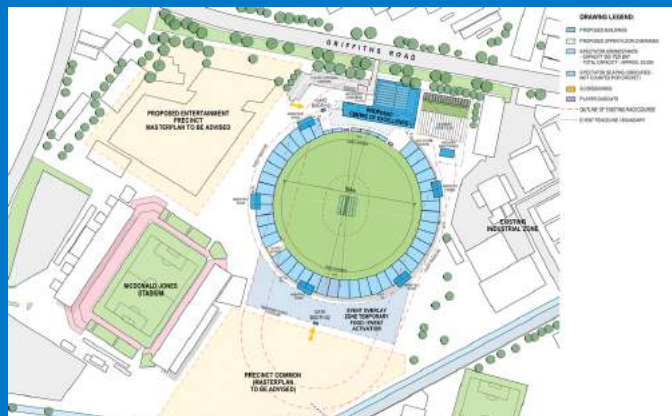
Newcastle and the Hunter plays a central role in the future of our game. It is critical that we ensure it remains home to a vibrant cricketing community into the future.

Cricket NSW's vision is to bring elite content, such as international cricket, WBBL and BBL to Newcastle and the Greater Hunter can only be achieved if suitable facilities are available long term.

Venues NSW are currently undertaking a business case on the Hunter Park Precinct and this presents a significant opportunity to construct a boutique oval stadium (similar to Manuka Oval) within the precinct. Under this proposal, the current entertainment precinct, which is close to the centre of Newcastle and accessible public transport links, will provide a long-term home for first-class and international cricket matches, AFL and events that attract fans and visitors alike to the region.

PROPOSAL

- Approve the re-location of the Newcastle Harness Racetrack.
- Instruct Venues NSW to specifically consider, as part of their business case, the construction of a 15,000 pax oval stadium situated next to Macdonald Jones Stadium on the current site of the Newcastle Harness Racetrack.

REGIONAL CRICKET CONTENT STRATEGY

Regional NSW is the heartland of cricket in our state. Despite having a smaller population than metropolitan Sydney, regional NSW accounts for around half of the state's registered players; more than 250 adolescent cricketers (aged 13-19 years) in the CNSW pathway system; and produces over 50% of NSW's contracted professional cricketers.

Over the past decade regional communities have been through tough and trying times. From drought through to bushfires and Covid-19 the resilience and fabric of these communities has been tested significantly. Cricket NSW has been standing by these communities throughout these tough times, and now as they begin to rebuild, providing up to \$6 million in bushfire, Covid and flood relief for local cricket infrastructure.

Cricket NSW is committed to supporting these communities by providing much needed economic uplift and tourism. Since 2020 BBL games have been played in Coffs Harbour and this year a BBL fixture will be played in Albury. With a raft of cricket content available, including BBL, WBBL Sheffield Shield, Marsh Cup, WNCL, State Youth Championships, grade cricket carnivals and much more, we feel we can support these communities by scheduling content within the regions.



PROPOSAL

Schedule a variety of cricket content in Regional NSW to drive economic uplift within those communities. This content includes;

- BBL
- WBBL
- Sheffield Shield
- Marsh One day Cup
- WNCL
- Cricket Carnivals

Cricket NSW have engaged consultants DHW to undertake an economic benefit analysis of scheduling cricket content in regional NSW and the costs associated. This report is expected to be completed by February 2023.

SCG MASTERPLAN



The Sydney Cricket Ground (SCG) is NSW's premier cricket venue steeped in history and prestige. However, the lack of any significant investment, compared to other sporting stadia across the country including; Optus Stadium, Adelaide Oval, construction of a new stadium in Tasmania and the proposed \$1 billion re-development of the Gabba highlights the risk that the SCG will slip further down the rankings as a top tier sporting venue.

This famous and popular venue has some of the oldest spectator facilities in the country, and similar building code compliance issues that saw Parramatta Stadium and the SFS rebuilt. There is now a clear contrast to the new \$828 million Allianz Stadium and \$330 million CommBank Stadium built for the football codes.

In the 2022/23 NSW Budget, \$3.5 million was allocated to develop a detailed business case and Master Plan across Venues NSW precincts. The masterplan of the SCG is needed to identify much needed upgrades at the venue. These include upgrades to the outdated Brewongle, Churchill and O'Reilly stands.



PROPOSAL

- Instruct Venues NSW to begin work on the SCG Masterplan to identify much-needed upgrades at the venue.
- Work with the NSW Government and AMPS to provide adequate parking options available within the Moore Park precinct.

ALLIANCE OF SPORTS TO COMBAT MENTAL HEALTH

Community sporting clubs and organisations are overwhelmingly operated by volunteers. From mum’s and dad’s operating a BBQ on gameday to the countless hours dedicated to run training sessions and prepare sporting fields for upcoming games. Sporting clubs make up the core fabric of our communities.

Thus, community sporting clubs are often the first place members of the community go to feel safe, secure and connected. They are well placed to engage directly with community.

However, these clubs, run by volunteers aren’t equipped to deal with society’s increasing strain on mental health.

That’s why Cricket NSW has partnered with the NRL, AFL and Netball NSW to deliver bespoke mental health programs within our sports.

This funding will allow Cricket NSW to expand on its successful Baggy Blues program and rollout GamePlan, a research driven online modular program to community clubs and associations. Following completion of the modules a workshop with current players and external providers will be provided along with completion of a mental health first aid course.

SUPPORTING MULTICULTURAL COMMUNITIES

Sport transcends languages and cultures, it provides the opportunity for our newest Australians, some of society's most vulnerable and at risk, a place which is not only physically safe but also emotionally safe. It provides the opportunity to celebrate diversity and inclusion within our multicultural community.



Since 2018, Cricket NSW, along with other sporting codes, has been provided funding to engage in specific programs that support our multicultural communities, these include;

- Thunder leadership program
- Community Cricket activations and connections
- Teacher development and resources for schools in high multicultural areas
- Cricket programs and Gala days
- Thunder Nation Cup

These programs are well attended by members of the community and have been highly successful. With the increase in new Australians originating from Southeast Asia, the demand for such programs is expected to increase.

PROPOSAL

- Continuation of \$400,000 in funding to Cricket NSW over 4 years to deliver multicultural programs.
- \$50,000 to research and develop targeted multicultural programs for South Asian communities in NSW.

CONTINUATION OF MUCH-NEEDED FUNDING

With increasing development, urban sprawl and population growth in Sydney, it is imperative that local sporting facilities keep pace and are provisioned for.

Whilst some facilities have seen investment through government funding programs, there is still more to do.

Continuation of the following government grant programs:

- Multi-Sport Facility Fund
- Active Kids Vouchers
- Regional Sport Facility Fund
- Female Friendly Community Sport Facilities and Lighting
- Local Sport Grant Program
